ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia, Sept. 10—Smorgasbord and fish chowder are among the specialties of the local Ras Hotel, where hyenas howl under your window at night and you are awakened in the morning by a military band.

The band is part of the British-trained imperial guard, which marches smartly up Viale Mussolini—now called Churchill Boulevard—in its bare feet each morning en route to the emperor's palace on the other side of town.

The hyenas are part of an animal chorus that makes hideous sounds in Addis Ababa at night. I find, though, that I prefer the hyenas' raucous laughter to the hideous shrieks of the jackals that used to surround my hotel in Tehran, the capital of Iran.

Gas Reserves Lower  
But Crude Oil Gains

NEW YORK, Sept. 10 (UPI)—The nation's gasoline reserves suffered another setback in the week ended last Saturday, but production of crude oil reached another all-time high, the American Petroleum Institute disclosed today.

In a report that was delayed by a curtailment of data owing to the west coast oil refinery strike, the institute said that gasoline stocks dropped to 94,803,000 barrels from 95,504,000 a week earlier.

Daily average production of crude oil for the week reached a record 5,531,450 barrels, compared with 5,528,850 a week before, the previous high.
