

GOP Warned Not to Slight Senate Races

Party Stands Chance Of Losing Control

Republican Party workers were warned today not to make the mistake of overlooking GOP senatorial candidates in their efforts to elect the Dewey-Warren ticket.

The Republicans now control the Senate by a six-vote margin of 51 to 45. A shift of only four seats to the Democrats would place them in the majority.

And GOP Campaign Manager Herbert Brownell Jr. said the Democrats are spending much of their time and money to accomplish just that.

He told a meeting of Republican leaders in Chicago that the Democrats are concentrating on senatorial races in 10 Midwestern states—Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Kentucky, West Virginia, Tennessee, Iowa and Minnesota.

The GOP now holds six of these seats. Mr. Brownell called for a determined effort to keep them from going Democratic.

"This is our year," he said, "and we must make the most of it."

TRUMAN—President Truman on Sept. 17 will undertake one of the most vigorous campaign trips in recent political history. He will travel through Iowa, Colorado, Utah, Nevada and California in the first half of the two-week swing. Major speeches are scheduled for Des Moines, Iowa; Denver, Colo.; Salt Lake City, Utah; Los Angeles and San Francisco. He will make numerous other appearances along the way.

LABOR—The AFL Building Service Employees International Union announced it has decided to support the Dewey-Warren ticket. The union, which claims 175,000 members, supported the Roosevelt-Truman ticket in 1944. It was the first major union to come out for Dewey. The CIO and several major AFL unions have endorsed Mr. Truman.

DEWEY—The GOP presidential nominee intends to leave for New York City today to register for the Nov. 2 election. He will spend the night in New York and then go to his Pawling, N. Y., farm for the weekend.

WALLACE—Rain last night forced a postponement in the giant New York rally to "Welcome Home" Henry A. Wallace from his hectic tour of the south. It will be held tonight.

Russ Erect 'Wall' Around Students

WASHINGTON, Sept. 10 (UPI)—Assistant Secretary of State George V. Allen said today that Russia is building an "ancient-style Chinese wall" around its students and scholars.

He said in an address prepared for delivery to the U. S. Advisory Committee on Educational Exchange that Russia has decided to prohibit her students from studying abroad.

"At the present moment," he added, "the Soviet government is creating around its citizens, in the field of educational exchange, an ancient-style Chinese wall such as has not been seen since the Ming dynasty."

He said accumulating evidence "indicates that the Soviet authorities have determined that no Soviet child shall be educated outside the boundaries of the Soviet Union if the Soviet government can prevent it."
