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
Issues Warning On Political Work

Feeney Tells Firemen, Police to Vote Only

Mayor Al Feeney today promised strong disciplinary action against any member of the police or fire departments found taking part in political activities this fall.

In a letter to the Safety Board, he asked that group to instruct firemen and policemen that they must take no part in the campaigns of any candidate or party, other than to vote in the coming general election.

"This rule has been violated in the past to the detriment of the departments," the Mayor declared, "and we are going to make sure it is not violated during the campaign and election this fall."

Dial System Due On 2 Exchanges

Belmont, Cherry Lines To Change in Spring

Telephone subscribers on the Belmont and Cherry exchanges will begin using dial telephones next spring.

Dial central office equipment is being installed in the new Belmont and Cherry offices. L. W. Shumaker, division manager, Indiana Bell Telephone Co., reported today.

Part of Expansion

The new Belmont office is on Fuller Drive, just north of Washington St. and the Cherry building is at 5009 E. 38th St.

Dial telephones are being installed in the \$3.5 million expansion program, but they cannot be used until the telephone company gives the signal. That date is scheduled for spring.

Union Files Suit After Ferret Puts Some Zip in Job

AUCKLAND, New Zealand, Sept. 10 (UPI)—The electrical workers union sued an Auckland firm today on charges of unfair labor practices for employing a ferret to pull 600 feet of wire through a conduit.

The ferret was lured through the conduit, trailing the wire, by the scent of a rabbit at the other end. The trick saved the firm the cost of many weeks' work by electricians.

The union charged the company with employing an unregistered worker, paying insufficient wages and engaging an under-aged worker.

Oppose Extension Of W. 39th St.

A proposal to extend W. 39th St. across Tarkington Park has been delayed by the Works Board because of mounting opposition from the Park Board and residents in the area.

The petition to open the street between Illinois and Meridian Sts. was submitted to the Works Board by North Methodist Church, the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Co. and the Standard Grocery Co., owners of the land to the south of the proposed street.

Paul V. Brown, park director, said the department is opposed to the street because it would take away playground space and add an additional traffic hazard at Tarkington Park.

He said the Tarkington Park Civic League is circulating a counter petition.

Young Chip's Birthday Cake Will Never Be Sliced

CATONSVILLE, Md., Sept. 10 (UPI)—They found young Chip's "Happy Birthday" cake on the kitchen table, but it wasn't cut and won't be, ever.

For Chip was dead, and so were his sister and his mother and his cocker spaniel pup.

They were dead— asphyxiated by gas in their home—because Chip's mother, Mrs. Mildred McClellan, 43, decided it would be better that way.

From a terse note that Mrs. McClellan left and reports from family friends, police pieced together this story:

Two years ago Mrs. McClellan and her husband were divorced and she gained custody of their two children, 10-year-old Chip, whose real name was Philip Jr., and 11-year-old Mary.
