Detection 1st Step in Cancer Control, Physiologist States

Sees Possible Answer in Blood Tests
To Track Down Disease Incidence

Hard-to-find cancer will be much easier to control when scientists learn to find it through mass surveys, Dr. Andrew C. Ivy, noted physiologist, said here last night.

Dr. Ivy, here to address Indianapolis doctors on "The Research and Cure of Cancer," in the Medical Center, said some "acceptably accurate" serology (blood examination) might be the answer, but it will take time.

For those who believe we are at a standstill in cancer research, Dr. Ivy had facts to show otherwise. "If we can find cancer soon enough, we can cure, and that is the right word, from 30 to 50 percent of the cases."

The latest discovery in the control of cancer was made in 1941 when it was found that the female hormone would cure about 20 per cent of prostatic cancer and that the male hormone would do about the same for breast cancer in women, he said.

The presentation was made at a district meeting of the Indiana section of the American Water Works Association at the Elks Hall in Lebanon.

Lack of Permits Tops Fish, Game Violations

The number one violation of Indiana's fish and game laws is still hunting and fishing without licenses, John H. Nigh, director of the State Department of Conservation, announced today.

From a total of 681 persons named for violating the fish and game laws, 142 fishermen and 105 hunters were arrested for having no license for the fiscal year ending June 30.

Mr. Nigh also reported that 676 persons were convicted and paid fines and costs totaling \$15,804. Seventy-nine different offenses were listed in the past year's causes for arrest.

One of two men arrested in connection with a \$200 safe cracking in the Liberty Insurance Agency, 103 N. Alabama St., last Monday has signed a confession and is expected to plead guilty to burglary charges in Criminal Court 2 tomorrow, police announced today.
