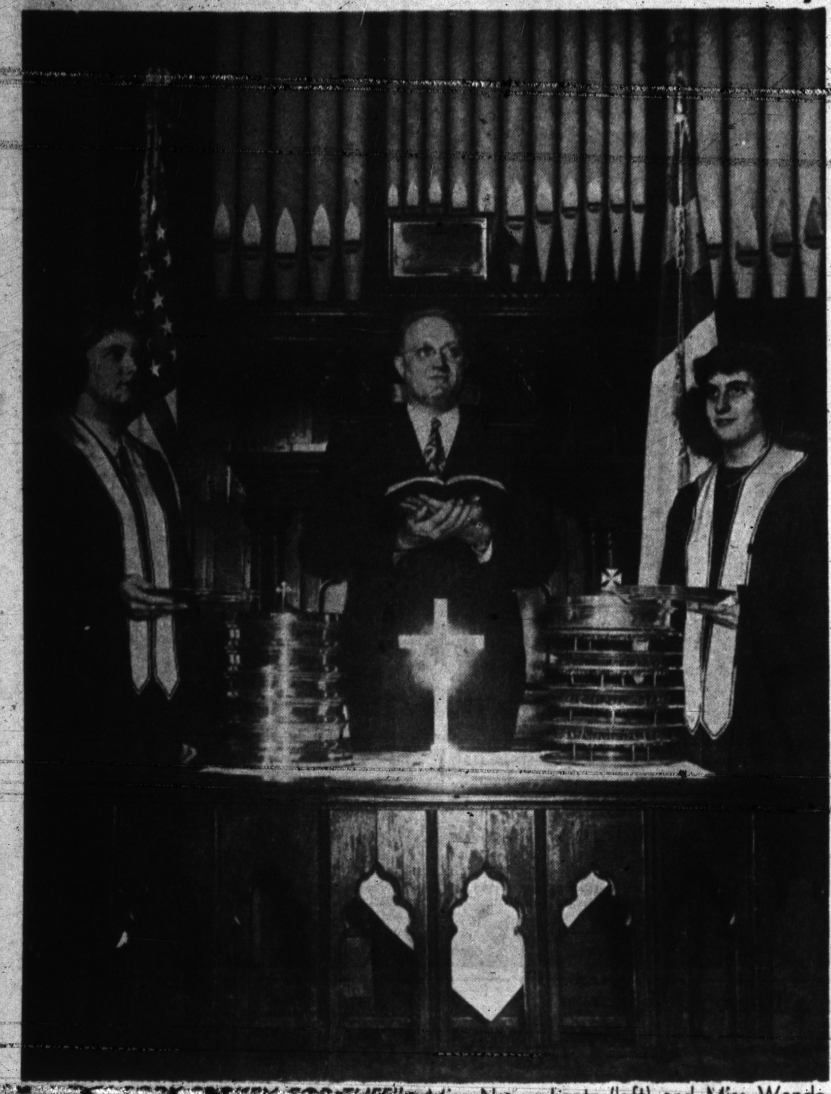


# Protestant Churches Here to Join In World-Wide Communion Day



Members to Observe Annual Occasion With Simplicity

Tomorrow will be one of the great religious days of the year with Protestants everywhere celebrating Worldwide Communion Sunday.

Indianapolis folk and those around the globe will receive the sacred elements in their churches. No fanfare marks the observance. On the contrary, the day shares the solemnity of Good Friday with its reminders of the crucifixion. The night before the crucifixion, Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, or Holy Communion.

Beginning with the 10:30 a. m. service in New Zealand, Christians on all continents will kneel at their altars or bow in their pews as they participate in the sacrament.

Thus a spiritual fellowship will bind together persons of many denominations, races and nationalities. All are expected to have repented of their sins and resolved to lead better lives in the future.

It is expected that World Communion will reflect a deeper meaning this time than ever before because it will follow so closely the organization of the World Council of Churches in Holland. The World Council meeting brought together in fellowship the most varied group of Protestants in history.

Hugh M. Mason, director of music, arranged the Communion Hymn to be sung by a choir of 50 voices during the 10:45 a. m. World Communion Day observance tomorrow in the East Tenth Street Methodist Church. The Rev. Charles R. Holmes, pastor, will officiate, assisted by Miss Nancy Lentz, and Miss Wanda Holmes, both dressed in white-colored robes with white stoles.

**Heads Youth Group**

Miss Holmes, daughter of the pastor, is spiritual life president of the Methodist Youth Fellowship of the local church. Miss Lentz belongs to the district cabinet of the Methodist Youth Fellowship.

Upon a signal from the ushers, members will move in orderly fashion to the front of the sanctuary and receive the elements kneeling at the railing. Offerings will serve a worldwide mission by being sent for overseas relief. The Rev. Mr. Holmes will conduct the communion according to church ritual used since the beginning of Methodism.
