Gates Challenges Charges of Foes
Governor Tees Off On Democrat Chief
Indiana's gubernatorial campaign got into the question and answer stage last night as Gov. Gates ripped into Henry Schricker, Democratic candidate, in a speech at South Bend.
The Governor charged in the most direct attack of the campaign on Mr. Schricker that the former Democratic governor either was deliberately misrepresenting facts about the Gates administration or was "grossly misinformed."
He asked six questions, designed to embarrass the Democratic nominee. A seventh question was Gov. Gates' own answer denying Democratic charges that he had destroyed the bi-partisan nature of the Alcoholic Beverages Commission and the Conservation Commission.
The questions sought:
ONE: An explanation of the contracts let by Democratic administration by which private individuals reaped the profits from operation of state park hotels and concessions.
TWO: An explanation of oil leases to Democrats on a 40-mile strip of the Wabash River which never was developed by the lessee and brought no oil royalties to the state.
THREE: An accounting of Mr. Schricker's own appointment of legislators to other state jobs although he now chides the GOP for doing the same thing.
FOUR: An explanation of what he intends to do to protect the public against utility strikes if his party repeals the Utilities Compulsory Arbitration Act as they advocate.
FIVE: A stand on whether the office of attorney general should be under the Schricker administration.
SIX: A public statement of his reasons for permitting the state merit system law to become effective without his signature or approval.
Ira Haymaker, State Democratic chairman, fired a blast at Mr. Creighton's stand on labor today. In a statement the party leader declared:
"Upon the basis of his own record, it is difficult to see how in the world Mr. Creighton ever hoped to get the support of any well-informed labor group."
Speech Prompts Blast
The blast, Mr. Haymaker said, was prompted by Mr. Creighton's speech recently in which he charged salaried leaders of labor unions were trying to dictate to the rank and file that they must oppose the Republican Party.
The Democratic chairman declared, "At the state CIO convention at South Bend recently, 700 delegates representing 250,000 other workers voted unanimously to support Mr. Schricker in the race for Governor. Mr. Creighton consistently has been against measures which would benefit working men."
