Gates Asks Cure To Get Car Death

Gov. Gates today appealed for more caution by motorists and pedestrians on the highways by police as the high traffic toll for September was announced.

State police report 122 lives were lost in accidents on Hoosier streets and highways last month. The Governor asked police and courts to "crack down on reckless drivers, speeders, unlicensed drivers and unsafe cars as you have never cracked down before."

He added, "If we do not greatly improve, we cannot hold fatalities below 1000 this year. Let every driver, pedestrian, state, city and town policeman, sheriff, prosecutor and judge accept his share of responsibility to see that this toll of death is reduced."

Charges City's Fuel Test Unfair

**Truck In Overdrive,
Firm Executive Says**

Charges that tests of gasoline used by the Indianapolis Fire Department were conducted unfairly were made today by an official of one of the fuel firms.

Rudolph Stempel, vice president of Associated Service Co., charged the test-fire truck was driven "in overdrive" when his fuel was being used in the vehicle.

"They claimed they didn't have any power," he said about the firemen operating the truck, "but anyone knows a vehicle lacks power when in overdrive no matter what gas is used."

Ordered Test Made

The tests were ordered yesterday by the Safety Board after Fire Chief Roscoe McKinney found fault with Associated gasoline being furnished the department under a current month-to-month contract.

Mr. Stempel said he and a chemist of the Rock Island Refining Co. accompanied the firemen on the test run. Mr. Stempel's firm obtains gasoline from the Rock Island Co.

He said the test began at the Fire Department garage, where the truck was drained of another brand tested earlier, and Associated gasoline was put in the tank.

'Shifted Into Overdrive'

The gasoline company official said he noticed the driver of the truck shifted into overdrive while the run was being made.

"At one point the driver slowed down for a turn and then accelerated without shifting gears," he said. "The vehicle did lack power but it was because it was in overdrive."

Mr. Stempel said the driver stopped the vehicle later and the fireman on the back of the truck, who was conducting the test, pointed out the vehicle's lack of power.

"When I asked them why they had run the test in overdrive they had nothing to say," Mr. Stempel declared.

Yesterday the state oil inspection division reported it had tested samples of Associated gasoline this week and found the product met all requirements of state standards. The division also stated it had made many other tests, previously, and had never found Associated gasoline to be substandard.

Trucker Faces Charges by Girl

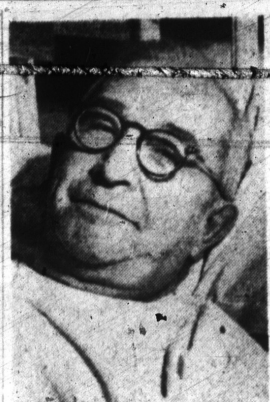

Police were on hand when Brannon finished unloading his cargo of crushed gravel, and made the arrest.
