1949 Proclaimed State Riley Year

Governor Says Poet A 'Part of Indiana'

Governor Ralph F. Gates has proclaimed 1949 the Riley Year, honoring the Hoosier poet and his works as "part of Indiana."

In observance of the centennial, the Governor urged all institutions and organizations throughout the state to "pay tribute to the Hoosier poet and thus build him a shrine where he would appreciate it most, in the hearts of Hoosiers."

Today is the 99th anniversary of Mr. Riley's birth.

The Governor read his proclamation at a statewide meeting of the Riley Hospital Cheer Guild. He said that of the ties which give Indiana a spirit of statehood, none is "stronger or more universal" than the influence of James Whitcomb Riley, the poet of the Indiana hearth.

The Hoosier poet was born on Oct. 7, 1849 at Greenfield. He was 66 when he died.

FBI Nabs Race Driver In \$40,000 Theft Case

DANBURY, Conn., Oct. 7 (UP)—Donald F. Devine, part-time suiky driver at the Roosevelt Raceway in Westbury, Long Island, was under arrest today by FBI agents and charged with embezzling \$40,000 from the Danbury National Bank.

The 28-year-old bank teller and father of two children waived examination and was released under a \$3000 bond. An FBI agent said Devine started to dip into bank funds last July in order to bet on the horses.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7 (UP)—The Economic Co-operation Administration today announced the appointment of David L. Patten, former Boston investment banker, as chief of its special recovery mission to Portugal.

Mr. Patten, a veteran of the World War II on the staff of the chief of naval operations, and later on Gen. Douglas MacArthur's staff. Since 1946, he has been a private consulting engineer.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7 (UP)—The housewife can expect to find more chicken at the corner market next year and the price will be down, the Agriculture Department predicted today. Because of this year's huge grain crop, it won't cost farmers so much to raise poultry, the report said.

Air Force Discloses New B-29 Jet Bomber

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7 (UP)—The Air Force came up today with a new piston-jet engine that will get bombers in and out of target areas with less danger from anti-aircraft batteries.

The new combination engine will be used on a streamlined version of the B-29 Superfort, known

as the B-54. It will enable bombers to go in on targets at high speeds and at altitudes above 40,000 feet.
