In 1919, he was made athletic director of Shortridge High School, and when the Indiana Athletic Officials Association was organized he was made secretary. He held both positions until his death.

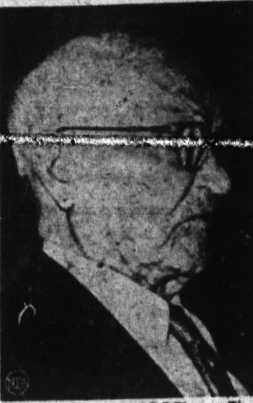
For many years he was official timer for the State High School Basketball Tournament in the Butler Fieldhouse. He was also penalty timer for the hockey games in the Coliseum.

They met Republican Senator Chapman Revercomb.

But they did not worry over the fact he is the hard-pressed candidate whose relationship with GOP leadership is a trifle delicate since he failed to respond to Gov. Thomas Dewey's requests in the special session to broaden the displaced persons legislation.

Gov. Warren usually makes his introduction of the Warren woman in the final flourish of his speech. It gives impetus to applause as the whistle blows and the train pulls out.

It's not their problem to take note—as others did—that the reference to Sen. Revercomb earlier in the speech was in impersonal, almost token terms.

But they have chores.

Besides the platform appearances and ceaseless parlor-car pleasantness, the "stand here, please" for pictures, Mrs. Warren writes numerous thank-you notes daily and corresponds with the other five children back in California.

ONE feminine frailty mother and daughter have abandoned. They are never late. But Virginia has learned to time her getting up in the morning to just that point in her father's speech which will give her minutes for scrambling into clothes for the tag-end introduction.

Is all this useless in campaigning? By no means.

More than practical hostess help is offered by the Warren women. No speech showed it more than the appeal for government keyed always to people. This was a speech stronger than any before in its emphasis on "youngsters as the greatest natural resource of all," on government's responsibility toward "livable homes in wholesome environment."

Such reasoning is typical of Gov. Warren's fundamental approach to government. He views its function in terms of the American family. He learned this from his own family.

So these two women—smiling, cheerful, natural—are more valuable symbols of Warren the man than anything a party publicist could devise.

required the utility to pay \$500,000 more in wages annually, increases in cost of materials totaling at least \$200,000, and a decrease in riders were cited as causes for the financial troubles.

Although the utility proposed no specific method of bolstering its financial condition, three methods were outlined by Harry Reid, railways president, at the American Transit Association Convention in Atlantic City two weeks ago.

These were: The restoration of the 2-cent transfer charge (transfers now are free).

Express fares—increased rates for longer travel.

Express fares—higher fares for express service to outlying districts.

Utility officials are expected to press for a combination of these methods of increasing revenues.

As the rate increase request was filed, Mayor Feeney conferred with utility executives on measures to relieve bus overcrowding. This was blamed for bus-policing car accident downtown Tuesday in which 19 persons were injured.

Residents of E. 38th St. meanwhile were asking their neighbors to sign petitions demanding crostown service on that principal northside artery.

Article Confirms Teamster Move

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.—The International Teamster, official organ of the Teamsters Union, was published in Washington for the first time, today and confirmed reports that the union will move its headquarters here from Indianapolis.

This confirmation came in an article written by President Daniel J. Tobin of the union entitled "Union Solidarity Shown at Meet."

It is designed to discount charges made by Lester Hunt, who got out the Teamster when it was published in Indianapolis, that Mr. Tobin now takes orders from Dave Beck, Seattle labor boss and member of the Teamsters executive board.

After being fired from his union job, Mr. Hunt blamed Mr. Beck. He wrote a newspaper story saying Mr. Beck not only wants to boss the Teamsters but the whole AFL, and then have a showdown fight with CIO.
