## Local Deaths— Services to Be Held Today For J. Lloyd Wayne III

Services for J. Lloyd Wayne III, former general toll supervisor for the Indiana Bell Telephone Co., who died Sunday in his home, were to be held at 1:30 p. m. today in Flanner & Buchanan Mortuary.

Burial was to follow in Cincinnati, O.

A native of Cincinnati, Mr. Wayne, who was 74, was a graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and was first employed on the engineering staff of the J. L. Wayne III New York Telephone Co. He was a patent reviewer for the Bell System.

Author of Handbook

In 1903 and 1904, he was a faculty member at MIT, as instructor in mechanical and telephone engineering. He was the author of the telephone section of Foster's Electrical Handbook.

Mr. Wayne joined the staff of the Central Union Telephone Co., Indiana, in 1904, as state division equipment foreman. In 1911, he was transferred to the traffic department where he served until 1918, when he was appointed special agent for interest companies.

Mr. Wayne returned to Indiana Bell as general supervisor of the traffic department in 1923, after engaging in other work three years. He continued in traffic work until his retirement in 1939, after 40 years of service with the Bell System. He was considered an authority on long distance operating practices.

He was a charter member of the Hoosier State Chapter, Telephone Pioneers of America, and was president of the organization in 1924.

Mr. Wayne is survived by a sister, Mrs. G. Y. Anderson, Cleveland, O., and several nieces and nephews.

## Rites Set Today For Local Veteran

**Officer to Be Buried In Washington, D. C.**

Graveside services and burial for 1st Lt. N. J. Crawford, Army Air Force, whose body was returned to Indiana from an Alaskan military cemetery, were to be held at 2 p. m. today in Oak Grove Cemetery, Washington, D. C.

Lt. Crawford was killed in 1945 when his C-54 plane crashed into a mountain near Anchorage, Alaska. He was based at Albertus as a member of the Alaskan Division, Air Transport Command.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. I. N. Crawford, 926 N. Bolton Ave., Lt. Crawford enlisted in January, 1942, and was commissioned a twin engine instructor at George Field, Ill., in December, 1942. He went to the Alaskan Division the following month.

He was graduated from Arsenal Technical High School in 1938, and attended Purdue University two years. He was born in Washington. Lt. Crawford is survived by his parents, a sister, Mrs. George M. Gille, St. Louis, and a son, Michael.
