Strict Gambling Curbs Pledged

Candidate Says He's For Fair Enforcement

Enforcement of gambling laws against clubs as well as "uninfluential individuals" was pledged by George S. Dailey, Democratic candidate for prosecutor, in a speech before party workers at Democratic headquarters last night.

"Public opinion is divided on the gambling question," he said. "A large group believes in strict enforcement of the gambling laws against all citizens. Another group believes that gambling laws cannot be enforced and that gambling should be legalized by the state. A third group believes that these laws should be enforced as to certain classes of people and not enforced as to others."

Mr. Dailey said he will take office on a pledge that gambling laws must be enforced against all people alike.

"Because the operation of slot machines in country clubs enables some people to play golf cheaper than for others, it is no excuse for them to carry on such illegal operations while the poor and uninfluential go to jail for visiting a take-out poker game," Mr. Dailey said.

State Acts to Halt Gold Mine Ads

A Canadian gold mining company today was ordered to stop an advertising campaign in Indiana which offers gold mine shares as prizes in a contest to name a new mine.

Kenneth Weddle, commissioner of the Indiana Securities Commission, said he had ordered L. B. Scott and Co., Toronto, to stop doing business in the state and set Oct. 25 as date for a hearing on the order.

He ordered the company to show cause at that time why it should do business in Indiana after it was reportedly barred from California and Pennsylvania.

Mr. Weddle issued the order after persons in Terre Haute and Ft. Wayne complained they had received advertising material on the mine naming contest. It is reported the company has offered 10,000 shares of stock as first prize in the contest.

Mr. Weddle said the company is not entitled to do business in Indiana because it has not met two provisions of the state securities law. He said to meet the provisions, the company must offer its stock through a licensed dealer in Indiana and before this can be done the securities must be qualified with the state commission.

State Fair Adds To Parking Area

The State Fair Board has taken an option on an area north of the Indiana School for the Deaf to be used as additional parking space for the State Fairgrounds.

The announcement was made today by Rue J. Alexander, lieutenant governor, who said the parking facilities afforded by the 23-acre plot would fill a long-time need. Shortage of parking space closed automobile gates on several occasions during this year's fair.

The lieutenant governor also announced plans for acquiring land to be used as a small Fairgrounds air field but he said no date has been located. Farmers could use such a field to bring livestock to the fair by plane.

Former Trooper Chief Hunted After Accident

Austin R. Killian, former State Police superintendent, was the target of a chase last night by the State Police he once commanded.

Troopers said Mr. Killian failed to stop after sideswiping a car driven by Dugger Gene Smith, Franklin, near the city limits on U.S. 52.
