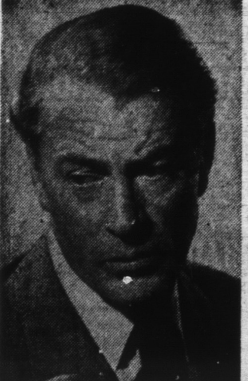

Council Delays Dog Leash Vote

Passes Ordinance
On Weed Cutting

Indianapolis proposed dog leash ordinance will have to wait for another council meeting for final passage as city councilmen ignored the controversial issue last night in their hasty, election-eve meeting.

Bent on bringing official business to a quick conclusion so that they could get back to "more pertinent issues" connected with the election, the councilmen side-stepped the dog leash ordinance.

SPCA Opposes Plan
Nevertheless, there were those in the gallery opposed to the measure who had made it a point to be at the meeting to make sure the ordinance wasn't slipped in for a deciding vote.

The ordinance would require all dogs to be on a leash when off their owner's property. It is strongly opposed by the Indiana Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

On the council's list of business accomplished was passage of an ordinance prohibiting traffic southwest-bound on Massachusetts Ave. from turning left into Pennsylvania St.

Order Weeds Cut
Councilmen also passed an ordinance to force property owners to cut weeds on vacant lots in the city.

It specifies that if the owner does not cut the weeds the Works Board will order them cut by the street commissioner and the cost will be added to the owner's taxes.

No notice shall be required from the city to any lot owner.
