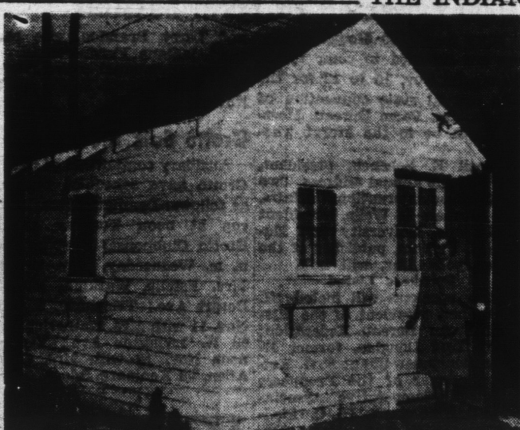

Widow Wins \$3707 Suit From Building Contractor

Carries Case Successfully to Court After Cost of Dream House Goes Over Estimate

More than a year ago, Mrs. Ruth L. Hathaway, a widow, contracted to build her dream house.

Before it was finished her costs had risen from the original estimate of \$4500 to \$7076.24. In addition, she was sued for \$794.99 in mechanics' liens by two building supply houses.

Mrs. Hathaway took her troubles into the Superior Court of Judge John L. Niblack in a suit to recover \$2345.55 which she was forced to pay to complete the house over the contractor's estimate and the amount of the liens.

Planned Modest House.

Today, Judge Niblack awarded her a \$3707.54 judgment against the contractor, Joseph P. Braun, of 211 E. Minnesota St., to cover her excess costs and the liens.

Mrs. Hathaway planned a modest house for herself. One son,

wound up in court when mechanics' liens were filed against the property by two building supply houses. They contended the contractor failed to pay them for supplies used in building the house.

The widow told Judge Niblack she paid the contractor a total of \$3505 of the agreed cost shortly after the contract was signed. She testified that Mr. Braun walked off the job when she complained of shoddy construction.

Running low on funds, Mrs. Hathaway said she was forced to sell most of her personal possessions including antiques, a fur coat and family heirlooms. She managed to raise \$2358.55 and applied it to construction costs.

At the outset of the trial Mrs. Hathaway entered a petition to recover the amount of the liens. Simultaneously, Mr. Braun filed a cross-complaint for \$2100 he claimed was due on the house. In his decision, the judge ruled Mrs. Hathaway would have to satisfy the claims brought by the building supply houses.

New Castle Driver Killed in Crash

Robert Lee Lykins, 24, of New Castle, was killed early this morning when the car he was driving ran off the road and hit a bridge abutment, state police reported.

The accident occurred on Ind. 3 about three miles north of Mt. Summit in Henry County. Mr. Lykins was thrown clear of the car. It has not been determined whether he died of a broken neck or of drowning. His head was in six inches of water when he was found.

A passenger, Ervin Hacker, 20, also of New Castle, owned the automobile which Mr. Lykins was driving. Mr. Hacker suffered severe facial lacerations, and is being treated in Henry County Hospital, New Castle.

Dismiss Bowers Burglary Charge

A first degree burglary charge against Clifford Ward Bowers, 56, whose jury trial was covered by Life magazine last spring, was dismissed today by Judge Saul I. Rabb.

The motion to drop the charge that Bowers burglarized the home of Mary Rapa, 4827 College Ave., an Indianapolis bondswoman, was filed by Deputy Prosecutor Raymond Tindall in Criminal Court 2.

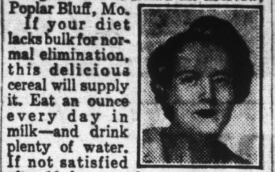

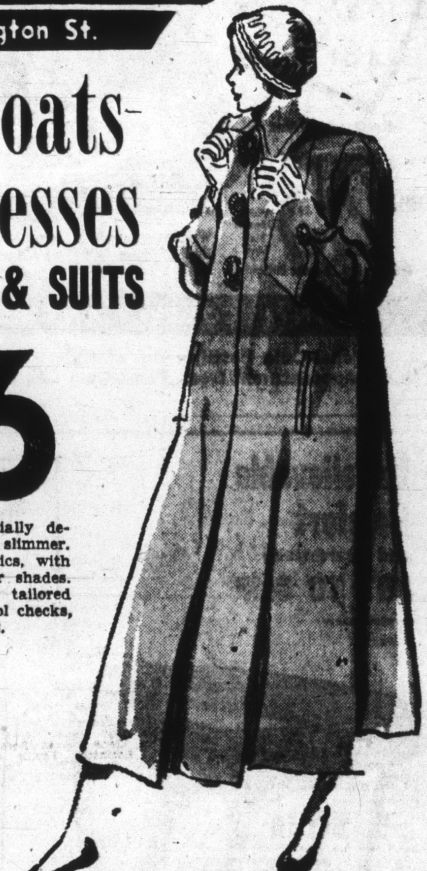
