All-Star Forum Roster To Speak Here This Winter

Local Series Will Feature Five Discussions
On American Foreign, Domestic Affairs

A program of five speakers who will discuss America's critical foreign and domestic problems in a lecture series this fall and winter was announced today by the Indianapolis Open Forum. The forum, a community-wide sounding board of Hoosier opinion, is sponsored by the Kirshbaum Community Center Association assisted by 12 civic organizations. Night lectures will be held at the Kirshbaum Center, 2314 N. Meridian St.

Leland Stowe, author and foreign correspondent, will launch the series Nov. 17 with an analysis of "Berlin, Powder Keg of Europe."

Mr. Stowe will outline the history of the Berlin crisis and its relationship to the struggle for Germany. A public question period will follow the correspondent's speech.

Second Forum Speaker

Carey McWilliams, author of "A Mask for Privilege," will be the second Forum speaker Dec. 8. His subject, "To Secure These Rights," will explore civil rights trends in the United States since the end of the war.

Bartley Crum, who publishes the New York Star, successor to Marshall Field's PM, is the third speaker. He will speak on "The United States and Palestine" Jan. 5.

Mr. Crum will be followed by Michael Straight, editor of the New Republic magazine, who will speak on "The Coming Depression."

Final forum speaker will be Dr. Margaret Meade, anthropologist and associate curator of the American Museum of Natural History. Dr. Meade will discuss "Family Life in Post-War United States," an analysis of what has happened to the American family since the war.
