56 Subjects Offered In 12 Weeks Course

Fifty-six courses have been scheduled for the technical institute division of the Purdue University Indianapolis Center this winter.

Registration will be held from noon to 8 p.m. Dec. 17 and 8 a.m. to noon Dec. 18. Classes for the 12-week term will start Jan. 3.

Orientation tests for new students will be given from 6 to 10 p.m. Dec. 10. Veterans planning to enroll for the first time should apply immediately to the Veterans Administration in order to secure their certificate of eligibility by registration time.
