Services for Staff Sgt. John LaMar, killed Oct. 8, 1944, in Italy, will be held at 10 a. m. Wednesday in Shirley Brothers West Chapel. Burial will be in Washington Park.

Sgt. LaMar, who was 23, was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest L. LaMar, 30 N. Elder Ave. He was killed while serving in a communications operation for the 8th Division of the Fifth Army. He also served in the North African campaign.

A lifelong resident of Indianapolis, he was graduated from George Washington High School. He was a member of Washington Street Presbyterian Church.

He worked two years as a deliveryman for L. Strauss & Co. He enlisted in August, 1942, and was sent overseas in November, 1944.

Besides his parents, he is survived by two brothers, Victor and Ernest LaMar Jr., and a grandmother, Mrs. Ethel Raeburn Young, all of Indianapolis.
