

# Realtors Rap Backers of Housing Bill

State Socialism Is Goal, They Charge

WASHINGTON, Nov. 27 (UP)—The National Association of Real Estate Boards said today that promoters of public housing are working toward state socialism.

A pamphlet published by the board's legislative committee said a "clever propaganda campaign" about housing has been developed by a coalition of "planners," socialists and radicals.

"The objective of this powerful coalition is... simple: State socialism, with all its dangerous implications," the group asserted. "Control of housing is their first and logical step."

The pamphlet, entitled "The World Owes Me a Living," apparently was an attack on public housing features of the Taft-Elliender-Wagner bill. President Truman will ask Congress in January to revive and enact this measure.

Draw Parallel

The bill failed to pass in the 80th Congress. It would lay down a long-range housing program, including incentives for private industry, and federal subsidies for construction of 500,000 units of low-rent housing.

The real estate group pointed out that many people think meat costs too much. Yet few of them, the pamphlet added, would propose that the government go into the meat business.

"Why, then, should the situation be so different when the commodity is housing?" the realtors asked. "Why the loud demands for the federal government to launch a gigantic low-cost public housing program?"

"The answers are simple. A clever propaganda campaign by a coalition of 'planners,' socialists, and radicals has so twisted the facts surrounding housing that some people are beginning to believe that the government owes me a house at half price."

## Typist Gets on Royal High-Horse Even as a Queen

LONDON, Nov. 27 (UP)—The blond London typist who claims to be queen of the Bamangwato tribe of Bechuanaland, South Africa, warned today that she'd be "very rude" to any British officials who try to separate her from her husband and her throne.

Two months ago Ruth Williams wed Seretse Khama, heir to the chieftainship of the 100,000 Bamangwatoans. But Khama's uncle, acting as tribal regent, has steadfastly refused to let a white woman become queen.

Mrs. Khama said she had been told that Sir Evelyn Baring, British High Commissioner of Bechuanaland, has flown to London to solve the crisis. But he did not make his scheduled visit to her tiny topfloor flat today.

"HE would have been wasting his time anyway," she said.

"This is a matter between my husband and me," she warned. "If Sir Evelyn is coming to try to part us I'm going to be very rude to him. My one hope now is to go with my husband to Bamangwato and help him rule. The fact that I would be one white woman among 100,000 people is not worrying me."

Khama who now is under his uncle's eagle eye in Bamangwato, writes her twice a week, she said—"what lovers write to one another."

### A Family First-Aid Kit

Small cuts and bruises are a part of every child's growing up. In general, it's a good thing to take a matter-of-fact attitude about them. If mother fusses over the minor wounds or if in any way, the youngster is made to feel that he should have some very special attention whenever there's an accident, the whole thing takes on too much importance.

One way of taking care of the situation is to have a family first-aid kit to which the youngster can go for a band-aid, mercurochrome, tincture of green soap, or whatever your doctor thinks is good for cuts and scratches.

It's a good idea, too, to have the youngsters in on deciding what should be in the kit and to talk over how one decides that a cut is small enough to be taken care of by one's self and when there needs to be some consultation with mother or father.

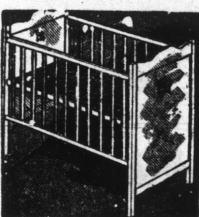

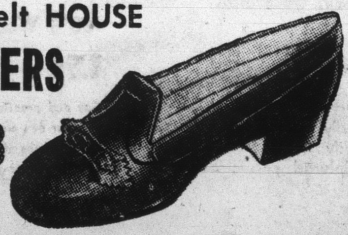
