Parliamentary Law—

Committees Bear Burden Of Work

Group Divided Into Three Classes

MOST OF THE work in any organization is accomplished by committees. They may be divided into three classes—boards, standing committees and special committees. All are subject to the same rules of procedure. The principal object of referring a question to a committee is to have it discussed more thoroughly than would be practicable in a meeting of the society, therefore, a committee may not limit debate. A majority of a committee must be present to transact business.

It is the duty of the chairman to call the members together and to preside over the meeting. Should he fail to issue a call, any two members of the committee may call a meeting, notifying every member, including the chairman.

Unanimous agreement outside a properly called meeting is not the act of any committee. Dissension in clubs is often caused by committees working by phone, or perhaps by the chairman taking things into his own hands, disregarding other members of the committee.

The chairman takes an active part in discussion, and may submit motions and vote on all questions without relinquishing the chair. He has not the right to dictate the policies of the committee. The majority vote, not the chairman, decides any question.

The report to the society must contain only what was agreed upon by a majority vote in committee meeting.

If the chairman favors the report, he usually makes it. If he votes with the minority, the committee chooses a "reporting member" who approved the report, and is prepared to defend it on the floor. The minority may, with consent of the assembly, present its views.

Majority Vote Can Reopen Polls
Q—If the polls have been closed, may they be reopened?
A—Yes. The polls may be reopened at any time before the tellers start to count ballots. The motion to close the polls requires a two-thirds vote. The motion to reopen them requires only a majority vote.

Q—If a president of a club is absent from the city, would the vice president attend committee meetings occurring during the president's absence from the city?
A—No. When the president is made ex-officio a member of a committee, it applies only to the president. The vice president cannot take his place. An ex-officio member has all of the privileges of any other member of the committee, but is not counted in determining a quorum.

In the absence of such special rule, the president may be invited to attend committee meetings. This invitation is through courtesy to the office he holds, and, as a guest, he does not have the privileges of active committee members.

Some laundries now use a mildew-preventing chemical, which is locked into linens by modification of an old method for fire-proofing textiles.

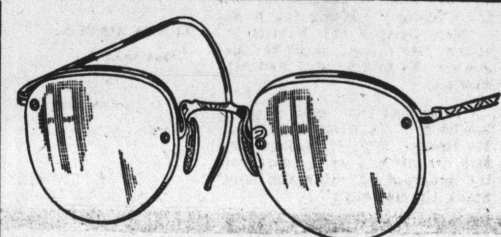
Three hundred pounds of laundry can be treated for a few cents, and the life of the fabric is greatly prolonged.

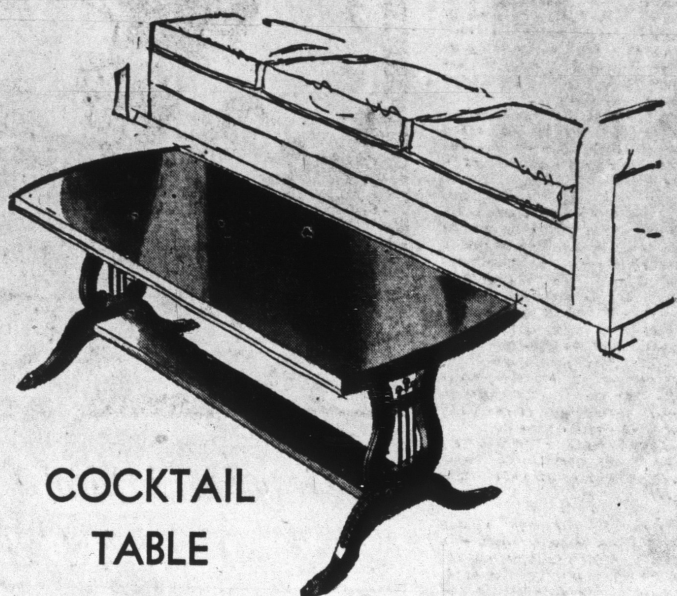

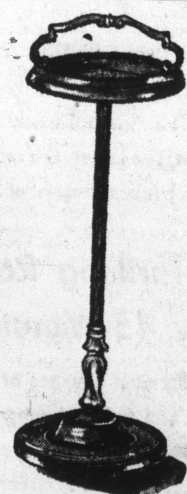

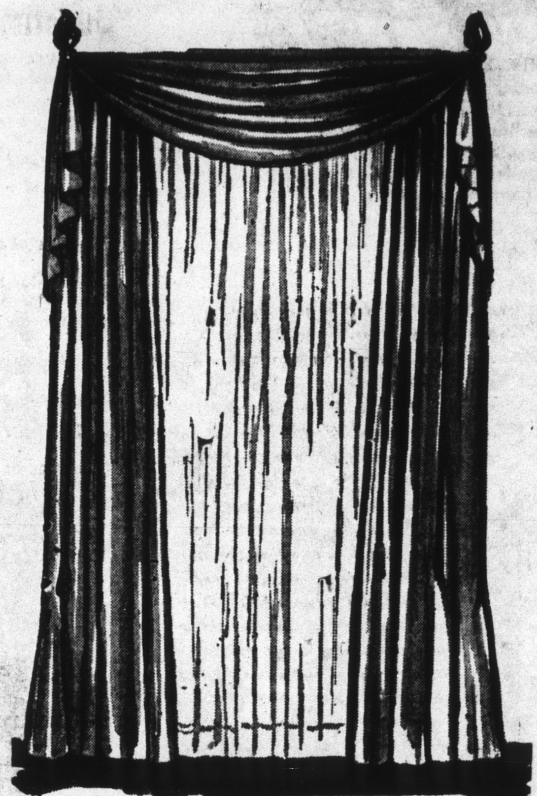
