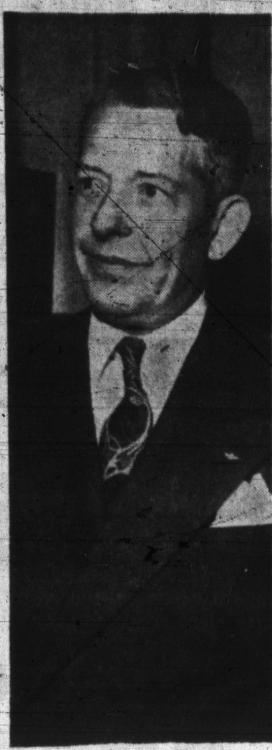


Oaths of Office Seat New Administrators Behind County Desks

Funeral arrangements have not been completed.

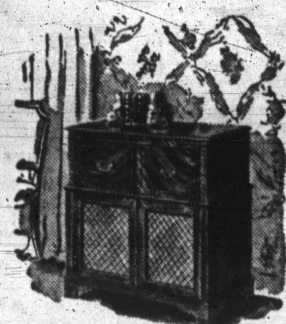
LIVESTOCK MAN DIES

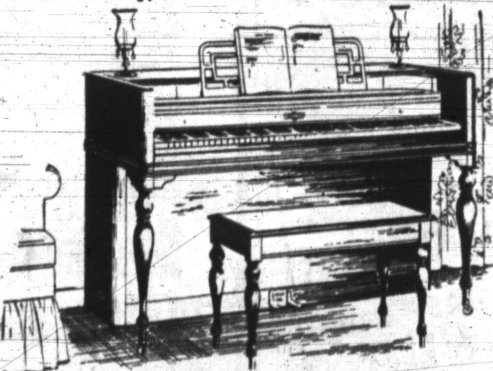
