

Loyalty Tests Called Feeble By Spy Inquiry

Charges Reds Hide In Federal Posts

WASHINGTON, Jan. 1 (UP)—House investigators said today that Communists and Red spies have penetrated so deeply into the government that the \$17 million loyalty program is only a "feeble defense."

The statement was made by the House Un-American Activities Committee in a pamphlet "100 Things You Should Know About Communism and Government."

"Communists have spent the past 15 years hiding their key men in our Army, Navy, Diplomatic Corps, Treasury, and other control points of government," the committee said.

The pamphlet is the last of five on the committee's findings on communism. The others covered Communist activities in the United States generally and in religion, education and labor.

Favors Cut in Size

Meanwhile, the incoming chairman of the committee called for sharp reduction in its size and for a code of fair practices to govern its hearings.

"I would gladly support any move to set up rules of procedure similar to those we have in the courts," said Rep. John E. Wood (D. Ga.), former judge. "I also think we could do a better job if the committee were reduced to five members or preferably three."

Mr. Wood, who headed the committee when it was last controlled by Democrats, said its members would have no other committee assignment.

"Their only job should be the investigation of un-American activities," he said.

Should that recommendation be followed, it probably would force Rep. John E. Rankin (D. Miss.) to leave the committee. He is slated to be the chairman of the House Veterans Affairs Committee.

The Carlises have left that coal shed at 1249 Bridge St. Mr. and Mrs. Howard Reynolds of near Linton offered them a house, 10 miles north of Martinsville.

Santa Claus ceased to be an unmentioned myth when the mailman began stopping at the coal shed following The Times' story about the Carlises. The first card to arrive brought new hope, and read:

"We only have a trailer, but if we had a house we'd share it with you." Mrs. Carlisle had just arrived home that afternoon with her sleeping son on her arm, after hours of house hunting.

Walks Miles to Bus

Everybody in the family is eating at once for the first time since July. They ate by turns on a card table and shared two beds in the coal shed. Everybody is talking at once, too, glowing with plans for the better tomorrow and swing Mr. Carlisle plans to build this summer.

Gifts, many anonymous, were received by the Carlises—clothing, food, money and cards—from all over Indiana. One woman donated a livingroom suite and dresser, just right for the Carlises' three rooms.

Mr. and Mrs. Norwood Dayton of Tynall, Towne took them house-hunting. P. R. Mallory Co., Inc. gave them a party with gifts and \$44 for moving. Nordyke Baptist Mission, Trinity Methodist Church and Bridge Street neighbors added to the gifts.

Trojan Horse

The report on Red spies said Communists did not begin infiltrating the government until 1933 when the United States first recognized the Soviet Union.

With Soviet recognition, the pamphlet said, the Communists began "the famous 'Trojan horse' or 'United Front' program by which Communists were directed to say less in public about violent revolution and do more toward corrupting from within."

The "main inflow" of Communists was into four depression born agencies—Public Works Agency, Works Progress Administration, Agricultural Adjustment Administration and National Recovery Administration—the committee said.

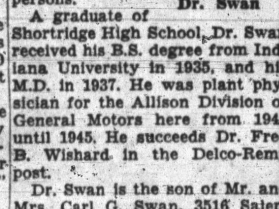
Dr. R. C. Swan Gets New Post

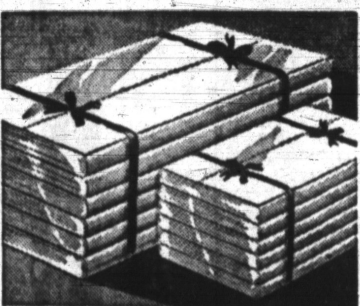

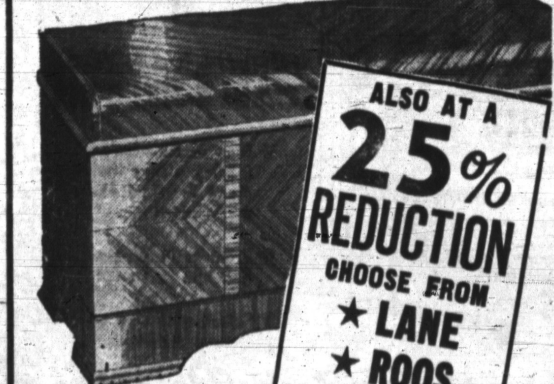
