Wants Career Men For State Troopers

Girl, Fiance Rescued After 45 Hours in Snowbound Car

Huddle in Blankets, Sit on Each Other's Feet To Keep Warm in Colorado Blizzard Ordeal

DENVER, Jan. 6 (UPI)—You couldn't convince Myrla Dodero today that there was any truth to the song, "I Got My Love to Keep Me Warm."

Miss Dodero, 17, a pretty Denver high school senior, spent two days cooped up in a coupe with her fiance, Phil Deweling, 23, during the big blizzard that swept the West. The two were returning to Denver Sunday night when Mr. Deweling's convertible skidded off the snow-covered highway in an isolated section.

For the first few hours the car heater kept them warm. Then the gasoline supply ran out, Miss Dodero said. They spent the first night huddled together beneath blankets.

Car Nearly Covered

"The snow piled up on the car until it was nearly all covered except the left window," she said. "All day Monday we tried to keep warm. At times we even sat on each other's feet to keep them from freezing."

Miss Dodero's grandmother had packed a box of animal crackers and marshmallows for her 4-year-old sister and they ate those.

"They lasted until Monday," she said, "and we ate snow to quench our thirst."

The snowplow reached them Tuesday afternoon, 45 hours after they skidded off the road.

They plan to be married next June.

Motions to send the protests were passed yesterday at the luncheon meeting of the committee in the Columbia Club. The messages will be addressed to the British ambassador in Washington, D. C.

Call Conditions Unhealthful

It was brought out in the meeting yesterday that the Jewish persons on Cyprus are living under most trying and unhealthful conditions which entail great suffering. They wish to settle on the mainland of Israel and would be welcome there but are not permitted to go.

Orderly and carefully thought out methods for locating displaced persons are in operation in Indianapolis, but not in the state, Louis Greenberg, yesterday's luncheon speaker said. The committee, therefore, voted to appeal to Governor-elect Schriener to set up co-ordinated arrangements in the state for bringing the DP's to Indiana.


Dr. Martin Presided





DENVER, Jan. 6 (UPI)—You couldn't convince Myrla Dodero today that there was any truth to the song, "I Got My Love to Keep Me Warm."

Miss Dodero, 17, a pretty Denver high school senior, spent two days cooped up in a coupe with her fiance, Phil Deweling, 23, during the big blizzard that swept the West. The two were returning to Denver Sunday night when Mr. Deweling's convertible skidded off the snow-covered highway in an isolated section.

For the first few hours the car heater kept them warm. Then the gasoline supply ran out, Miss Dodero said. They spent the first night huddled together beneath blankets.

Car Nearly Covered

"The snow piled up on the car until it was nearly all covered except the left window," she said. "All day Monday we tried to keep warm. At times we even sat on each other's feet to keep them from freezing."
