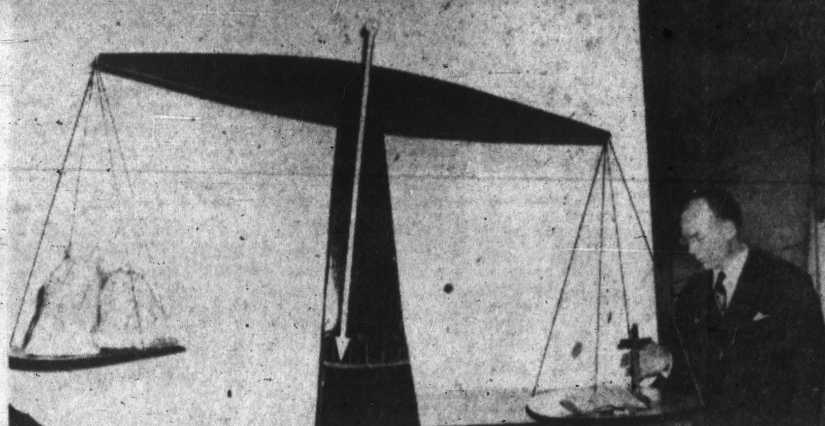

Pastor to Use Huge Scales In Illustrating Sermons

The Rev. Amos L. Boren is demonstrating the theory that people will come on Sunday night to his Roberts Park Methodist Church or any other church if the services are made interesting.

A survey indicates that very few churches hold worship services on Sunday nights. Many have youth programs then but adults worship takes place in the majority of the churches in the mornings on Sunday.

The congregations average several hundred persons on Sunday nights at Roberts Park. The pastor attributes this to the colorful programs he and his helpers provide.

Plan Series of Talks—Tomorrow night the Rev. Mr. Boren will open a new series of original addresses which he has named "A Preaching Platform," or "Sermon in Symbols."

"The Balances of God" is the title of tomorrow night's sermon at 7:30 p. m. A huge set of scales with a 6 ft. model of the Bible as a background will offer a focus for attention. Among the scriptural passages to be read is Daniel 5:27—"Thou art weighed in the balance and found wanting."

The pastor will illustrate his point as he talks by use of the large scales. At a certain moment he will place the Bible and the cross symbolizing the Christian life in the scales opposite material gains.

Use Blue Floodlights—Among other things, he will dramatize the thought that a man cannot cheat God; that good must outweigh evil; truth, falsehood; and selfishness, selflessness.

Blue floodlights will be used to play upon the scene and special music will be directed by Mrs. Omar Rybolt. Mrs. Vivian Arbaugh, organist, will play.

Others of the "Preaching Platform" series include: "A Radio Scripture Lesson" employing the church's public address system, Jan. 16; a legal trial of Mr. and Mrs. Average Citizen whose child was brought into court on the charge of vandalism, Jan. 23; and the presentation of a one-act play, "The Coming of Light," giving the story of Miles Coverdale, translator of the Bible, Jan. 30.

The pastor will discuss in detail the latest activities of the FOR in all its addresses. The FOR is an international religious organization advocating the non-violent solution of all problems between nations, races and classes.
