WIRE-WLW 9:30 p.m. NAVY'S GIANT ENDS First Coast-Coast Round-Trip Flight

MOFFETT FIELD, Cal., Feb. 7 (UP)—The Navy's giant Lockheed Constitution completed its first round trip early today when it landed from Washington with 100 passengers aboard.

The plane set down at 2:14 a.m. (Indianapolis time) at Moffett Field airport, about 50 miles south of San Francisco. It had left Washington at 8 a.m. (Indianapolis time) Sunday. The flight took 14 hours and 14 minutes.

The four-engine, double-decked jet giant made one stop at Olathe, Kan., on the "right west." It carried 81 passengers and 19 crew members. Comdr. William H. Collins was the pilot.

IN COMPLETING the round trip, the plane set records for the largest number of passengers ever to take part in a transcontinental flight. When it left here Thursday, it carried 90 persons.

Authorities earlier feared that the Constitution might have to be diverted to another field on its arrival in northern California. However, storm conditions which had prevailed earlier in the evening lifted enough to allow the plane to make a contact landing.

## Hint Dewey to Run For Senate in 1950

GOP Leader May Seek Sen. Wagner's Seat

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7.—Gov. Thomas E. Dewey will deliver the Republican Party's biggest Lincoln week address here tomorrow night amid a murmuring rumor that he may again run for political office.

Recent Albany dispatches to such carefully edited newspapers as the New York Times and the Chicago Daily News have speculated that Gov. Dewey might again be a political candidate.

The 1952 presidential election is too distant and the election of last November too recent to permit much discussion of Gov. Dewey now in connection with another shot at the White House.

The talk revolves around Gov. Dewey for Governor of New York in 1950 or as a candidate for the United States Senate in that year.

Conceded by Foes

Despite his two consecutive strikeouts as a Republican presidential candidate, Gov. Dewey would be a strong candidate for Governor or the Senate in his own state. Even the Republican politicians here who do not like him concede that.

Wagner Unable to Run

The Senate vacancy in New York state will come with the end of the current term of Sen. Robert F. Wagner, a Democrat. Sen. Wagner has been ill for a couple of years and is quite incapable of seeking re-election.

The GOP urgently needs to gain his Senate seat. It is equally important to the Republican Party to maintain its control of New York state.

The political atmosphere awaiting Gov. Dewey here is not very friendly. Some Republican members of the House and Senate will not show up for the dinner at which he will be the top speaker.

Others to Speak

Sen. Margaret Chase Smith, Maine, and Sen. Edward Martin, Pennsylvania, also will speak. Out of courtesy to those two every congressional Republican will attend the dinner who otherwise would have stayed away.

Gov. Dewey has not said much since his presidential defeat in his capacity as chief executive of New York. Tomorrow's speech will be his first important and purely political appearance since the campaign.

## U. S. Lowers Prop On Potato Prices

1949 Figure Is \$1.12 Below Last Year's

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7.—Another deflation note: Today, for the first time since before the war, the government lowered its price prop under a farm commodity.

The agriculture department announced a support price of \$1.80 per 100 pounds for all 1949-crop potatoes. This is \$1.12 cents lower than the price floor the government is maintaining now under 1948-produced No. 1 potatoes—the kind most housewives buy.

It should mean potatoes at least a cent a pound cheaper for consumers when the 1949 crop starts reaching the market within three months.

Lost \$150 Million

"If it doesn't," said one agriculture department official, "it won't be the fault of the government."

The Agriculture Department, after losing more than \$150 million supporting prices of the 1948 potato crop, is taking full advantage of the permission granted by the last Congress to cut potato price support to 60 per cent of parity. Potato prices have been supported at 90 per cent of parity (the supposedly fair price to the farmer) since 1943.

In addition, the department is instituting another gimmick which actually cuts the government floor under No. 1 potatoes to less than 60 per cent of parity.

In the past the government supported potato prices by grades, paying on the 1948 crop an average of \$2.92 per 100 pounds for No. 1 potatoes and only \$1.46 average for No. 2 grade.

Its new \$1.80 single support price is a weighted average price which it will pay for all potatoes, best, medium and lowest grades.

Technically 60 per cent of parity on No. 1 potatoes would be \$1.08 per 100, but the government is going to pay only \$1.80.
