**Ex-Local Resident  
Died Over Germany**  
Services for Sgt. Richard A. Schmutte, former Indianapolis resident who was killed May 12, 1944, in a bombing mission over Merseburg, Germany, will be at 9:30 a. m. Saturday, Feb. 19, in St. Peter and Paul Cathedral. Burial will be in St. Joseph's Cemetery.

A graduate of Tech High School, Sgt. Schmutte was an employee of the Allison Division of General Motors Corp. before entering the Army Air Corps Feb. 16, 1942. He was 23.

He went overseas in April, 1944, serving as an 8th Air Force tail gunner. Official notice of his death was not received until October, 1944.

Only immediate survivors are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Herbert A. Schmutte, 3547 N. Gladstone Ave.

Killed on Luzon**  
T-Sgt. Kenton B. Carter, former Indianapolis resident, who died May 2, 1945 of wounds received in action on Luzon, Apr. 28, 1945, will be buried Monday in Forest Lawn Memorial Park, Glendale, Cal., following services Monday in the Little Church of the Flowers there.

Sgt. Carter was wounded while serving with the headquarters company of the 32d Infantry Division.

He lived in 1820 Ruckle St., before going to California to work for the Lockheed Aircraft Corp. A graduate of Technical High School, he was a member of the Danville Christian Church. He enlisted Jan. 23, 1943.

Sgt. Carter served in Australia, New Guinea, Netherlands East Indies, Leyte and Luzon, and held four battle stars.

Survivors include his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Raymond O. Carter, and a sister, Miss Doris Carolyn Carter, all former Indianapolis residents now living in Los Angeles.
