UAW Opens Drive
At Chicago Plant

Ask Harvester Plant
Workers to Switch
CHICAGO, Feb. 16 (UP)—The CIO United Auto Workers Union passed out pamphlets at the International Harvester Co. plant here today to members of the rival CIO Farm Equipment Workers Union, which it seeks to take over, but there were no disorders.
Thirty-five UAW organizers appeared at Harvester's tractor works and distributed the literature to 3000 workers, urging them to desert their union in favor of the UAW.
Fifty policemen watched the organizing drive to prevent any outbreak of rioting such as resulted in injury to 22 men when the UAW staged a similar demonstration at Harvester's East Moline, Ill., plant last Thursday.
Today's action, when the Harvester early shift reported, was without incident, however.
