

Baptists Here Buying Shares In Denomination's 'Extra Fund'

Indianapolis Baptists are buying shares in their denomination's \$2.4 million "extra fund" for home and foreign missions.

The Northern Baptist Convention with which more than 30 local churches are affiliated will give \$5.1 millions this year through its "regular" channels for missions. This "extra fund" will bring the grand total for missions for the fiscal year to \$7.5 million.

To stimulate interest in raising these sums for home and foreign missions, the church is encouraging the gift of definite sums called "Shares for Success." The Garden Baptist Church already has "sold out" its allotted shares.

The Rev. Clive McGuire, Baptist city executive, ministers to Garden Church.

Each share costs \$24 and must be paid for by Apr. 30, the end of the fiscal year. The Garden Church has a large chart showing all shares sold and several paid for. Indianapolis Baptists are asked to purchase shares totaling \$20,000.

Dr. J. M. Horton, executive secretary of the Indiana Baptist Convention, is responsible for the sale of "Shares for Success" in the state.

Study Ways To Teach Lent Lessons

Presbyterian Parents, Leaders to Meet

Presbyterian parents and children's leaders of Indianapolis will meet for an Easter Institute Monday to study the best ways to teach children about the Lenten season and the resurrection.

The Easter Institute will be held from 2 to 5 and 7 to 8:30 p. m. Monday in the First Presbyterian Church.

Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, Mar. 2, and close the day before Easter which falls this year on Apr. 17. The solemn events leading up to the crucifixion of Jesus and also His resurrection need very special treatment by parents and teachers of children, the church explains.

Christian Federation Prepares Courses in Religious Education

Spring district schools of religious education will open on the North, South and East sides of the city Feb. 28 and on the West Side Mar. 7. They will be sponsored by the Religion Education Department of the Church Federation and its director, Daniel R. Eshel.

The schools, beginning Feb. 28, will be in session for five successive Mondays at 7:30 p. m. closing Mar. 28. The West Side school will be in session on Mondays at the same hour through Apr. 4.

Moman tomorrow at 11:15 a. m. in the Westview Church. Dr. Clive McGuire, Baptist city executive, and pastor of the Garden Baptist Church, will open the institute Monday afternoon with devotions. Miss Trindie will discuss Easter songs and Dr. Andrews will outline the purpose of the Eastern institutes. Others on the afternoon program are Mrs. Robert King, Mrs. Joseph Johnson and Miss Helen Newcomb.
