## Baptists Here Buying Shares In Denomination's 'Extra Fund'

Indianapolis Baptists are buying shares in their denomination's \$24 million "extra fund" for home and foreign missions.

The Northern Baptist Convention with which more than 30 local churches are affiliated will give \$5.1 million this year through its "regular" channels for missions. This "extra fund" will bring the grand total for missions for the fiscal year to \$7.5 million.

To stimulate interest in raising these sums for home and foreign missions, the church is encouraging the gift of definite sums called "Shares for Success." The Garden Baptist Church already has "sold out" its allotted shares.

The Rev. Clive McGuire, Baptist city executive, ministers to Garden Church. Each share costs \$24 and must be paid for by Apr. 30, the end of the fiscal year. The Garden Church has a large chart showing all shares sold and several paid for. Indianapolis Baptists are asked to purchase shares totaling \$20,000.

Dr. J. M. Horton, executive secretary of the Indiana Baptist Convention, is responsible for the sale of "Shares for Success" in the state.

**How to Be Saved—No. 2**

"Halt! You Are Under Arrest." "What does this mean? What have I done?" "You have been tried in absence for murder, and sentenced to die." What message could bring greater terror to a human soul? I am sorry to disturb you, friend, but this is exactly the message I bring to you today, for the holy Scriptures declare, "ALL have sinned," and "the wages of sin is DEATH." Rom. 3:23, 6:23. It is not to be an easy death, such as electrocution, but all sinners will "have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone; which is the second death." Rev. 21:8. Humanly speaking, there is no escape from this awful sentence of doom, but "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16.

However this great sacrifice will avail us nothing unless we feel our need, confess our sins, and change our ways. For He that covereth his sins shall not prosper; but who so confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy." Prov. 28:13. "We have the blessed assurance that 'if we confess our sins, He is faithful and true to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.' 1 John 1:9. We must not only confess, but believe down deep in our hearts that God, for Christ's sake, has forgiven us. 'For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.' Rom. 10:10. When we sin we transgress the law of God. 'For sin is the transgression of the law.' 1 John 3:4. Rom. 7:7. Therefore our confession must be made to God, who alone can forgive sin. Christ said, 'Ye shall ask Me nothing. Verily, I say unto you, Whosoever ye shall ask Me, I will do it for him in My name. He will give it you.' John 16:23. However we should confess our faults one to another, and ask forgiveness of those who have been affected by our wrongdoing. As another has expressed it: 'True confession is always of a specific character, and acknowledges particular sins. They may be of such a nature as to be brought before God only; they may be wrongs that should be confessed to individuals who have suffered injury through them; or they may be of a public character, and should then be as publicly confessed. But all confession should be definite and to the point, acknowledging the very sins of which you are guilty.' S. C. p. 43.

There are two kinds of confessions: one is forced from the guilty soul by fear of punishment; the other is inspired by a deep heart-broken sorrow for sin, such as was expressed by Job when he said, "I ABHOR MYSELF, and repent in dust and ashes." Job 42:6. A deep sense of guilt brings distress to the soul, which can be relieved only by a humble confession of our sin. The Psalmist says, "When I kept SILENCE, my bones waxed old through my roaring all the day long. For day and night Thy hand was HEAVY upon me—I ACKNOWLEDGED my sin unto Thee—and Thou FORGAVEST the iniquity of my sin." Ps. 32:3-5. Friend, let's confess, and get right with God and man today!
