**Red Cross  
Opens Drive  
For \$350,000**
**Story of Coatesville  
Relief Told at  
Kickoff Luncheon**

The \$350,000 Red Cross drive in Marion County opened today after a kickoff luncheon yesterday stressing aid given to Coatesville following the 1948 Good Friday tornado.

More than 2500 workers have been enlisted to ring doorbells in the campaign.

C. D. Knight, Coatesville banker, credited the Red Cross with providing a "heartwarming" service in the aftermath of the disaster. More than 600 representatives of business and industry heard the speaker's eyewitness account of the tornado.

More than \$10,000 in Red Cross relief funds was recommended for expenditure by the town committee on which Mr. Knight was a member.

**60,127 Families Aided**

Prior to the meeting the annual report of Red Cross activities in Indiana revealed that 60,127 families were assisted during 1948. The state organization received \$17,7532 during the year.

All campaign division chairmen and group leaders in the industrial, commercial, public service, governmental and educational divisions attended the luncheon. The downtown division will meet next Thursday.

**Study Aspirants  
For Nurse Award**

An outstanding Indiana nurse will be selected for receipt of the Linda Richards award in memory of the first professional nurse in America, the Indiana State Nurses' Association announced today.

The honored nurse will be selected from candidates whose qualifications are received by Mar. 1 by a committee composed of Dr. W. W. Wright of Indiana University; Miss Ruth Scott, director of Public Health Nursing, Ft. Wayne, and Miss Edwin MacDougall, director of placement and counseling for the state association.

Qualifications include graduation from an accredited school of nursing and registration between Aug. 1, 1948, and Mar. 1, 1949. The Indiana winner will be announced at the annual meeting of the association here next month.

BILLS PASSED

HB 379 (Mashling-Hafer)—Budget: Appropriates \$113,000,000 in operating funds and \$123,000,000 in capital appropriations from General Fund for state budget for 1949-51 biennium. (64 ayes, 0 nays.)  
HB 380 (Mashling-Hafer)—State Hospital Construction: Appropriates \$11,820,000 from General Fund for construction at state universities, state hospitals and institutions. (69 ayes, 1 no.)  
HB 381 (Mashling-Hafer)—Post-war Construction Fund: Appropriates \$11,506,500 from State Post-war Construction Fund for construction, rehabilitation and replacement of various state institutions. (72 ayes, 0 nays.)  
HB 382 (Grippo-Brennan)—Automobile Tax Increases: Increases registration fees on all motor vehicles. (74 ayes, 0 nays.)  
HB 383 (Horn-Kern)—Particulars: Betting: Prohibited—Prohibited for racing, commission and regulation of horse, dog and harness racing. (81 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 49 (McGinnis-Meier)—Marion County Clerk: Provides that Marion County chief deputy clerk shall be paid minimum of \$600 per month, a \$100 raise. (29 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 50 (Bates)—Teachers' Payment: Provides state and county commissioners of schools and teachers credit for time spent in the armed services in computing their seniority, class or rating purposes. (42 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 100 (Gardner)—Girls' School Age: Indiana Girls' School from 10 to 12 years and fixes maximum age for commissioners of schools to admit children to school. (42 ayes, 1 no.)

SB 101 (McGinnis-Evans)—Sewage Bonds: Permits cities and towns to defray part of the cost of sewage bonds, thus paving the way for the issuance of bonds for the remainder. (42 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 116 (Kendall)—F. Conrad—Auto Tax: Provides for a new state tax on motor of distributing funds from the Motor Vehicle Highway Account. Changes amount distributed from 10 per cent to 20 per cent of the fund, changing amount to 26 per cent instead of 24 per cent. Also provides that 65 per cent, instead of present 21 per cent of the amount of the fund will be distributed on mileage basis and 35 per cent instead of 48 per cent on auto registration. (42 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 226 (West-Kendall)—Vagrancy: Broadens criminal legal definition of vagrancy charge—“vagrancy” (42 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 227 (Davison-Watson)—Direct Primary: Provides for nomination of governor and United States Senators in direct primary and all other offices, instead of primaries in all other state party affiliation. (38 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 232 (Neumann-Rogers)—Financial Institutions: Authorizes certain types of financial institutions to establish branch loan offices. (42 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 241 (Woodworth)—Hoosier County Fair: Authorizes Indiana County Fair to make certain payments from general fund to school corporations. (40 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 270 (Bunting)—Widow's Allowance: Increases amount of widow's allowance from \$600 to \$1000. (42 ayes, 0 nays.)

SB 361 (Saylor)—Court Clerks: Establishes term of office for judicial clerks (Dearborn and Ohio counties). (38 ayes, 0 nays.)
