Yale to Represent District 1 in NCAA Basketball Tournament in Garden

**Total Entrants So Far Up to Five;
Lavelli Ties Mikan's Collegiate Mark**

NEW YORK, Mar. 3.—Yale, poised to grab off the Ivy League championship, today was named to represent District 1 in the eastern semifinals of the NCAA college basketball tournament.

The Yales were the second of the four teams to be named to the semifinals, Kentucky having been selected for District 3. Representatives from District 2, the East, and District 4, the Midwest, have yet to be selected.

Yale's selection came on the heels of the announcement that Western Kentucky will play in the invitational sister tournament to the NCAA in Madison Square Garden.

Ray Oosting, chairman of the NCAA selection committee, announced Yale's selection today through Asa Bushnell of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference.

Yale's record for this season is 20 victories and five defeats. W. Kentucky Accepts Bid Western Kentucky, led by its famed towel-tossing coach, Ed Diddle, will be making its fourth appearance in the invitational.

The Hilltoppers and Bradley University's Braves became the third and fourth teams to accept bids for the annual post-season shindig yesterday. Defending champion St. Louis University and Kentucky accepted invitations earlier this week.

Western Kentucky has lost only three games in 25 starts—to Kentucky, Louisville and Bowling Green. Its previous NCAA appearances were in 1942, 1943 and 1948.

Fourth Appearance
Bradley, with a record of 25 victories in 30 games, also will be making its fourth appearance in the invitational. The Peoria, Ill., team competed in 1938, 1939 and 1947.

There was little activity on the basketball front last night. However, Yale's Tony Lavelli managed to grab the headlines again as he equaled George Mikan's all-time record of 1870 points for his collegiate career by leading his Ell mates to a 71 to 55 victory over Connecticut.

Lavelli reached Mikan's mark by tallying 32 points. Mikan, now a member of the Minneapolis Lakers in the Basketball Association of America, set the record while playing at DePaul University.

Lavelli, the nation's leading scorer, reached the record with a basket in the last five minutes of the game at Storrs, Conn., but failed to eclipse the mark although he got four more shots before the final whistle.

Another Chance
The dark-haired star from Somerville, Mass., gets another crack at establishing a new record when Yale faces Harvard at New Haven Saturday night.

Columbia missed a chance to tie Yale for the Ivy League leadership by dropping a 48-to-45 decision to Princeton. Instead, the loss sent Columbia into a tie with the Tigers for second place.

The Lions, playing on their home court, led at the half, 19 to 12. But Princeton, behind Bernie Adams' sharp-shooting, deadlocked the game at 33-all midway in the second half. Adams, who scored 22 points, gave the Tigers a 45-to-44 edge by connecting on five straight free throws with two minutes to go. In the final minutes, Princeton converted three more free tosses while Columbia netted only one point.

In the remaining four-rounders, Joe Arthur, Indianapolis, will meet Willie Peirson of Cincinnati. Both are middleweights. Arthur made an impressive showing in the last fight show by defeating Mack Shea of Indianapolis.
