

### Expect 60 Millions At Work by Summer

CHICAGO, Mar. 18 (UP)—John W. Gibson, Assistant Secretary of Labor, predicted today that employment "should be hit-

ting 60 million again by summer." Unemployment benefit claims have been static for the past few weeks, he said, but a leveling off period is expected when the "seasonal" employment cycle increases. Mr. Gibson said that recent

unemployment was "not alarming, but must be watched." He said he "felt certain" that Congress would repeal the Taft-Hartley Act, and that the U. S. Mediation Service "will be returned to its place in the Department of Labor."

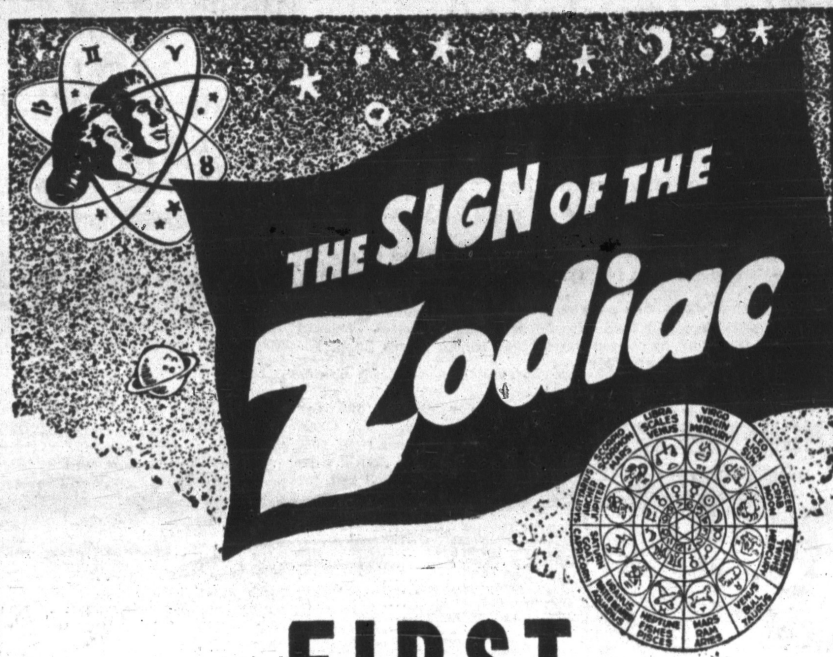
