War I Veteran

A veteran of World War I he served as wireless operator and telegrapher overseas and spent two years with the Army of Occupation in Coblenz. At one time he was with the American telegraph office in the American Embassy, Paris.

For the last nine years Mr. McCoy was employed as a telegraph operator by the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railroad.

Survivors include his wife, Ludmilla, whom he met and married in Budapest, and two brothers, Ernest L. McCoy, Lawrence, and Earl McCoy, Lafayette.

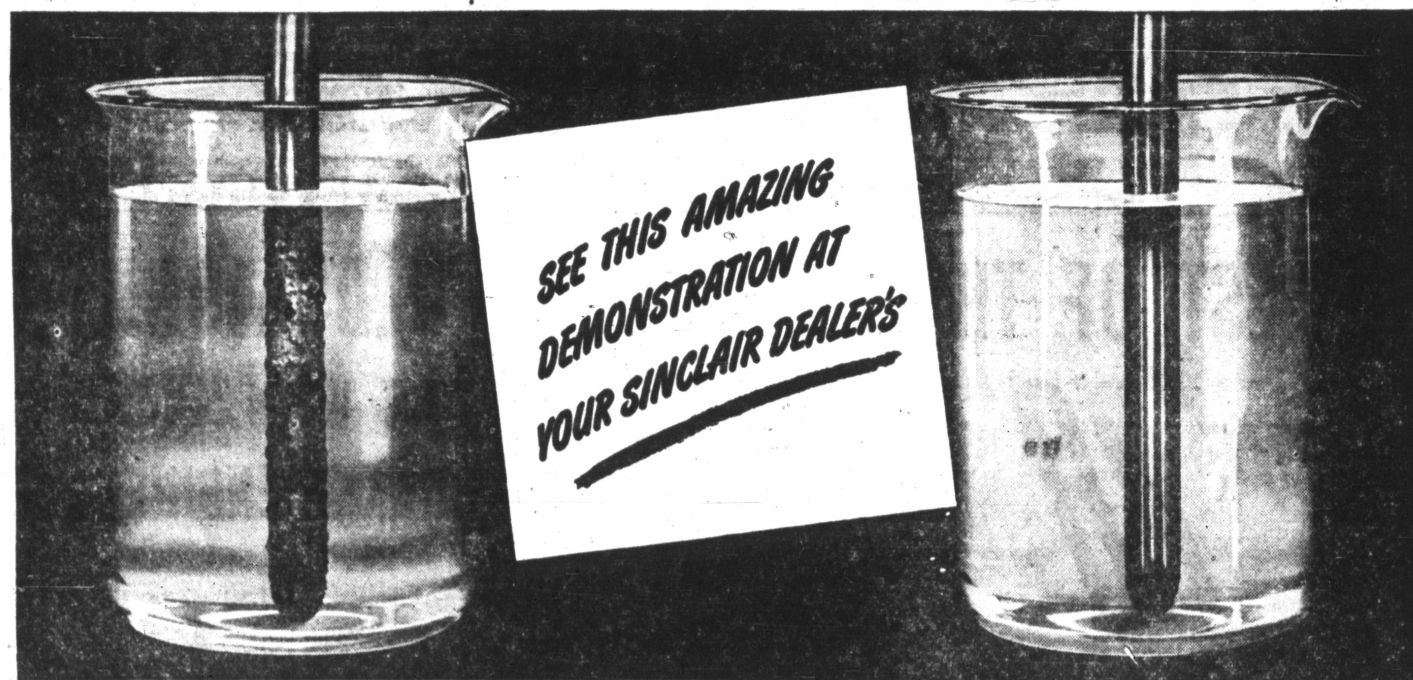
