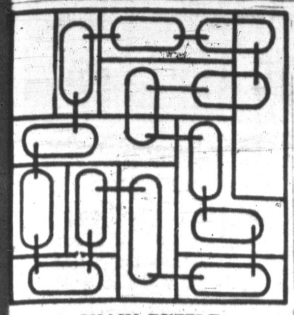


Mental Gymnasium

Stamp Notes

NEW YORK, Mar. 26 (UP)—Yugoslavia has announced a new stamp to commemorate the centenary of the death of Dr. Franc Presern. Dr. Presern was the greatest Slovene poet of the 19th Century.

A great Slovene patriot and nationalist, his influence on Slovene literature is notable.

The stamp is 10 dinars on slate and shows a sitting portrait of Dr. Presern with the dates 1849-1949 in the upper left hand corner.

FRANCE will add soon to its current series five new stamps featuring various provinces. The 10 centimes depicts Bourgogne; 50c, Guyene; 1 franc, Savoie; 2 fr., Auvergne, and the 4 fr., Anjou.

Four stamps also will be issued to attract the tourist trade: The 20 fr. pictures the Cathedral of Saint-Bernard-de-Comminges; 25 fr., portrays l'Abbaye Saint-Mandrie; 40 fr. shows a site in Vauvrais, and the 50 fr. has a site in Ardennes.

Besides a new series of five air mails will be issued composing figurines: 100 fr. vue de Lille, 200 fr. vue de Bordeaux, 300 fr. vue de Lyons, 500 fr. vue de Marseille and 1000 fr. vue de Paris.

DENMARK will honor the centenary of the Danish government with a new postage stamp on June 5. The denomination of the stamp will be 20 ore, but the design and color has not yet been announced.

PHILATELIC service will be provided at the post offices and the air mail fields of Chicago and Detroit for covers carried by the first flight to Zurich, Switzerland, on P. A. M. 27, on or about Apr. 1.

The present air mail postage rate of 15 cents per half ounce (10 cents for each air letter), will apply.

A special cachet will be applied to covers bearing the required postage and accompanied by request that they be sent by the first flight to Zurich.

Covers must reach the post offices or air mail fields not later than Mar. 29.
