





Big Airlines
Fight Cut-Rate
CompetitorsTranscontinental
Skycoach Travel
Inaugurated

NEW YORK, Mar. 31—Trans-

continental skycoach travel just

begun by Northwest Airlines,

with Civil Aeronautics Board ap-

proval, marks the first success-

ful step by major

airlines in their battle against

cut-rate non-scheduled airline

competition.

Next on the program, proba-

bly, will be Trans World Airline's exten-

sion of its present successful

Los Angeles to Kansas City sky-

coach service, from Kansas City

to New York.

Northwest has injected some inno-

vations which may partly revo-

lutionize mass air travel about

the country. It has modified

Douglas DC-4's in a way that will

allow flexible and immediate por-

tioning of passenger and freight

pay load.

Both fixed and collapsible seats

have been installed. Two fixed

bulkheads up front and a removable

door permit loading of cargo and

elimination of some of the seats.

The cargo compartment, even when extended, is cut off

from the passenger section.

Meals Eliminated

Costly meal service has been

eliminated by the various airlines

now operating skycoach service

over parts of their systems. Only

a few months ago, in protesting

suggestions that free meals were

padding up financial losses, the air-

lines contended that meals were

essential to continued good busi-

ness. A recent survey, however,

has shown that the majority of

skycoach passengers have come

from the railroads and bus lines.

Regular airline passengers still

are riding the "plush" planes.

On Northwest today, passen-

gers may travel from New York

to Seattle in a little more than

half a day for \$97, plus tax. Com-

parably low fares are fixed be-

tween intermediate stopping

places, such as Detroit, Milwau-

kee, the Twin Cities, Billings and

Spokane, the company reports.

"Fares between all points

served by special coach flights

are considerably lower than first-

class rail fares," he added. "The

fares figure about four cents a

mile, plus tax, one-third less than

regular fares."
