

\$300,000 Transmitter Gift of Dutch Catholics
 AMSTERDAM, Mar. 30 (UP)—Dutch Catholics will present Pope Pius XII with a new short wave radio transmitter valued at more than \$300,000 on the 50th anniversary of his ordination Sunday, a gift committee announced today.
 The money will be gathered by voluntary contributions, the committee said.
 Other Catholic groups, particularly in North and South America, were understood to be buying two more short-wave transmitters and a medium wave transmitter for the remodeled Vatican radio.

Island Foe of Kissing Films Establishes Preview Board

Bishop Classes No. 4 Movies as a Sin; 'Cover Girl,' 'Gilda' Among Objection List

 LAS PALMAS, Canary Islands, Mar. 31—Bishop Pildain of the Grand Canary Island has a zealous aversion to bathing beauties, kissing and dancing girls.
 So he has established a board, of which he is chairman, to preview movies to be shown in this Spanish colonial city. Pictures are rated No. 1, 2, 3 and 4.
 It has been made a sin to see No. 4 movies even though the pictures are shown without church objection in Madrid, Barcelona, Cadiz and on adjoining islands in the Canary group.
 Those who go anyway must tell their priests about it at confession, and, of course, "Gilda."

"School for Scandal" was cut Island, 58 miles away, to go to eliminate sequences showing confession. It was not a sin to kissing and sections of the human anatomy so it could get a No. 3 rating. Bishop Pildain, 60, and austere, decreed that it would pass but for "adults only."
 When "Gilda" was shown, it was rated No. 4 minus and Bishop Pildain wrote notes to all the priests on the island directing them to preach sermons against it.
 Thousands, however, turned out anyway. Most of them confessed their sins in seeing the Rita Hayworth film.
 Some went to see it and then took a trip to nearby Tenerife until they are near enough to the water's edge to shed them and quickly jump in.
 Movie house proprietors have stopped importing chorus girl pictures because they know they will get a No. 4 black mark. Pictures with a No. 1 church rating, however, go almost as badly because people think they must be too pure.
 No. 3 films go best because that means they are just basely cleaned up enough to stay out of the "sin" category.
 Carrying the campaign into real life, the bishop has decreed that sun bathers on the beaches of Las Palmas must wear suits extending to the neck. Bare midriffs are out.
