

Poor Grade Oil Changed Into Good Gasoline

Scientists Discover
2 New Chemicals
Deadly to Insects

SAN FRANCISCO, Mar. 31—Here's good news for you from chemists:

A new, low-cost process can help make high-grade gasoline from poor grades of crude oil. Two new death-to-insects chemicals are five times as potent as DDT.

One Step Necessary
Getting high-grade gasoline from low-grade crude oil can now be done in a single step, two scientists from the ESSO Standard Oil Company laboratories, Baton Rouge, La., told the American Chemical Society here this morning.

Dr. Alexis Voorhies, Jr., and W. M. Smith explained that the process removes sulfur from the oil with hydrogen gas at relatively low pressures. Previously, more costly methods used hydrogen at high pressures.

Just how much trouble sulfur can cause in the gas you use in your car has been measured by a team of DuPont chemists, H. K. Livingston, J. L. Hyde and M. H. Campbell reported that only one-tenth of 1 per cent of sulfur of the kind found in most gasoline will ruin the effect of half of the tetraethyl lead, added to prevent knock in your motor.

Alphabet Chemicals
BNB and BNP are not new federal bureaus. They are new insect killers which can control insects that survive DDT.

Dr. A. M. Bruner of DuPont said that the new alcohol made from coal, petroleum, air and water yields many chemical compounds.

Church Federation To Meet Tomorrow

**Social Problems
To Highlight Sessions**

The Indianapolis Church Federation General Assembly will meet tomorrow from 2 p. m. through dinner and a night session in the Woodruff Place Baptist Church.

Reports on an intensive study covering several months of social problems and the religious situation in the city will highlight the assembly sessions. Dr. Rose Sanderson of New York, national director of the Urban Church Conference, will speak. Dr. Sander-son heads the committee for cooperative research of the Federal Council of Churches and the Home Missions Council.

Four seminars have been meeting since December for the purpose of the local study under the guidance of the Church Federation. The results of their work will be discussed in tomorrow's assembly and recorded for use by the National Convocation of the Urban Church to be held in January, 1950, in a place yet to be named.

List Seminar Topics

Charles Boswell, chief probation officer of the Juvenile Court, heads the seminar reporting on "What Is Happening to the American City?" The other three seminars to present findings are: "What Is Happening to the American City Church?" with Dean O. L. Shelton of the Butler School of Religion, chairman.

Also "What Can the City Church Administrators Do About These and Similar Matters?" Dr. Clive McGuire, Baptist city executive, chairman, and "The Inner City Church," the Rev. Joseph W. Johnston, associate pastor of the Second Presbyterian Church, chairman.

Information in the seminar reports has come from the personal experience of pastors and laymen, the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce and various welfare agencies. Dr. Howard J. Baumgartel, church federation executive secretary, is in charge of the program for the assembly.

Boy's Hand Mangled In Manure Spreader

Official Activity to Start on Apr. 14;

Deserving Widow to Have House Painted

Although the official civic cleaning-up drive doesn't begin until Apr. 24, Street Commissioner Tony Maio said his department was starting immediately on the job.

Mr. Maio pledged his department's full co-operation at a meeting of the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce's Clean-Up, Paint-Up, Fix-Up Committee yesterday in the Indiana World War Memorial.

Offenders Subject to Fine
At the same time Mr. Maio issued a warning to drivers and others caught littering city streets. He said a policeman was assigned to his department to arrest offenders, who are subject to a \$50 fine.

Tom Bell, of the City Sanitation Department, also told the committee that plans were well under way to provide special collections for the added debris expected to result from the clean-up at homes.

Plan to Set Record
The deserving widow whose house will be painted free of charge will be selected next Thursday night at a meeting of the Metropolitan chapter of the Painting and Interior Decorating Contractors of America, Fred Lofquist, representing the chapter, said the meeting will be held at the Lincoln Hotel. He said an attempt would be made to break the record of 19½ minutes set on a one-story house last year. Some 50 painters will work on this year's one-story house.

Local school students are working on posters to publicize the Clean-Up campaign. It was reported by George P. Farkas, director of physical and safety education for the public schools. The students are competing for prizes of \$25, \$15 and \$10.

N. Y. Taxi Strike Set Tomorrow

**Some Owners to Ignore
John L. Lewis' Order**

NEW YORK, Mar. 31 (UP)—Operators of big taxi fleets and some independent owner-drivers said today they would continue service despite threats by John L. Lewis' taxi union that "not a wheel will roll" when a city-wide strike is called tomorrow.

Mayor William O'Dwyer, fearing the strike may develop into one of the most violent in recent years, ordered 2000 uniformed police to surround-the-clock duty starting with the walkout at 3:30 a. m. (Indianapolis Time) tomorrow.

The strike has been voted by the taxi drivers in an effort to gain recognition for Local 35, Taxi Workers Organizing Committee, affiliated with Mr. Lewis' catch-all district 50 the United Mine Workers (Ind.).

A similar strike called by Mr.

Lewis seven years ago ended in violence and defeat for the union. New York's taxi drivers have never received union recognition from their employers.

The National Labor Relations Board is powerless to call a union recognition election that would settle the dispute because Mr. Lewis has refused "on principle" to sign a non-Communist affidavit as required by the Taft-Hartley labor law.
