Blackwood on Bridge—Finer Points of Cue-Bid Method Pointed Out Here

WHEN Mr. Masters and Mr. Champion are partners they carry the refinements of their bidding a little farther than do most players. They know how to avoid the pitfalls of duplication of values.

In today's deal Mr. Champion had an aceless wonder. But when Mr. Masters jump-raised his opening spade bid he became interested in testing the possibilities of slam.

When a partnership has definitely established a certain suit as their trump suit then a bid by either partner in any other suit is a cue-bid, indicating first round control. Mr. Champion's second-round bid of four clubs was such a bid. It indicated ability to win the first club trick—with the ace or by ruffing.

This bid chilled Mr. Masters to the bone. He recognized it as showing a void in clubs (since he himself had the ace). He knew it represented a serious duplication in values and he bid a quiet "four spades," hoping Mr. Champion would pass.

But Mr. Champion felt that the hand would be safe at five-odd and that he was entitled to make one more try. He bid four no trump asking his partner to show how many aces he held excluding the ace of clubs.

Mr. Masters dutifully showed one ace outside of the club suit. That was enough for Mr. Champion. He knew the opponents had two "winning" aces and he signed off at five spades, the limit of the hand.

Had Mr. Champion bid four no trump without putting in the cue-bid in clubs, his partner would have responded showing two aces. And in that case he would have had no way of knowing whether they were the right aces or not.

Remember, if either you or your partner has cue-bid during the auction and later one of you bids four no trump, the responder must deduct the ace of the cue-bid suit (if he has it) in making his answer.
