Dr. George Robinson Plans Lecture Series

Dr. George L. Robinson, internationally-known Biblical authority and lecturer, will give a series of addresses on the Bible beginning tomorrow in the First United Presbyterian Church, Park Ave. and E. 22d St. The Rev. C. E. Bleekling, pastor, will preside.
