

Engaged Pair Among Eight Traffic Dead

Killed When Their Motorcycle Hits Auto on Bridge

Eight persons, including an Evansville couple who planned to be married Friday, were dead today in Indiana's week-end accident death toll.

Eleven others were injured in highway accidents, and a Newberry man was a drowning victim.

Dorrie Adler, 23, and his fiancee, Lillie Stiles, also 23, died when their motorcycle struck an automobile stalled on the Ohio River bridge at Evansville.

Owner of the car, Charles E. Brown, Harrisburg, Ill., told police his car stalled on the bridge and he was trying to push it when the crash occurred.

Mrs. Rose Lee Walker, 24, of 150 Geisenndoerfer St., was killed instantly yesterday when the automobile in which she was riding struck another vehicle head-on at 52d St. and Allisonville Rd.

Sheriff's deputies said the car in which she was riding was driven by Harvey LeRoy Haynes, 29, of 1264 W. 25th St. Another passenger in the car, Samuel Rodgers, 57, of 1008 Pearl St., also was injured.

Brothers Killed on Bike

According to deputies, Mr. Hayes' car swerved off the highway and back into the road into the path of one operated by Lauren Hendrix, 26, of 102 S. 11th St., Beach Grove. Mr. Hendrix and his wife, Olive, 24, who were injured slightly, were released after treatment at St. Francis Hospital.

Two young brothers, James Dolen, 9, and Duane Dolen, 14, both of Orlis in La Porte County, died en route to the La Porte County Hospital of skull fractures and internal injuries, after the bicycles they were riding were struck by an automobile on the Porter-La Porte county line road eight miles south of Michigan City.

Fred Grieger, Route 2, Michigan City, told police that the bicycle ridden by the Dolens brothers darted from an alley into the path of his car.

Girl, 14, Is Victim

Helen Boyles, 14, Bigelow, Ark., died when a car driven by her father, Andrew Boyles, 38, which was going south on Road 41, left the highway and smashed into a tree. Mr. Boyles and his wife, Ida, were reported in critical condition in Deaconess Hospital, Evansville. One of Mrs. Boyles' legs was amputated in the crash, police said.

A son, Wayne, 15, received a crushed pelvis, and another son, Phillip, 9, suffered fractures of both legs. A daughter, Lois Dean, 12, was removed to the hospital with both legs broken.

The accident, police said, occurred near the Evansville city limits.

Pedestrian Dies

A 70-year-old pedestrian, Frank McElvain, Franklin, died of injuries received after being struck by a car which police said was driven by Mrs. Helen Louise Smith, 34, of 303 E. Iowa St. The accident occurred on U. S. 390 a mile south of Indianapolis.

Services and burial for Mrs. Walker will be in Carbondale, Ill.

A native of Metropolis, Ill., Mrs. Walker was a member of the Friendship Baptist Church.

She is survived by her husband, Willie; six sisters, Mrs. Elva Siles and Mrs. Ruth Armstrong, Indianapolis; Mrs. Addie Mae Kimbrough and Mrs. Leveda Thors, Galesburg, Ill., and Mrs. Lorraine Mitchell and Mrs. Jewell Henry, both of Carbondale; two brothers, George L. C. Moore, Indianapolis, and Eugene Moore, Galesburg, and a cousin.
