

Spain Greets U. S. Navy With 21-Gun Salute

4-Ship Squadron First to Visit Port Since Before War Started

A four-ship American naval squadron, under the command of Adm. Richard L. Conolly, steamed into Ferrol Harbor, El Ferrol, Spain, shortly after dawn today on the first U. S. naval visit to Spain since before the war.

Adm. Conolly's flagship, the cruiser Columbus, fired a 21-gun salute as it entered the harbor. It was promptly greeted with a 21-gun salute from the batteries of Ft. San Juan.

The Columbus and the accompanying cruiser Juneau and the destroyers Stribling and Borden then passed in single file review before a Spanish squadron commanded by Rear Adm. Salvador Moreno aboard the cruiser Canarias.

The two flagships exchanged 17-gun salutes.

Adm. Conolly and other admirals in the fleet were expected to be received by Generalissimo Francisco Franco at his nearby summer estate, Razo de Meiros.

An elaborate schedule of receptions, luncheons and excursions was arranged for the 98 officers and 1914 men in the squadron. It was scheduled to leave next Thursday. The ranking officers in the party were to fly to Madrid next week for a brief visit.

Other world developments:

Switzerland

Georges Berti of the French government Board of Education told delegates to the Moral Re-arrangement Conference today that this is "one of the most critical hours in world history."

"The world must choose between the new hope that moral rearmament offers and the atom bomb with its consequences of destruction," Mr. Berti said.

He told the delegates he was going back to France to spread the doctrine of moral rearmament, and that he went with all his hatred for the Germans gone because of their "humility" at cau-

ca.

Geneva

Dr. William Menninger, American member of the United Nations health committee, warns that mental health problems would follow the economic development of backward areas.

Dr. Menninger, a prominent psychiatrist, warned that men's efforts to adapt themselves to "increased demands" and a "speeded-up tempo" resulted in mental breakdown.

He pointed to the fact that 716,000 persons were discharged from the American armed forces during the last war because of personality problems. This was more than were discharged for all other ailments combined, he said.

Korea
The South Korean government accused Russia today of trying to force north Korea to attack south Korea by threatening to halt the supply of arms to north Korea.

An announcement said: "The Soviet government recently directed the north Korean government to begin attacks on south Korea by the end of September. If this directive is not complied with, the Soviet government will halt the supplying of arms to north Korea."

Hong Kong
Unconfirmed reports said today Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek has arrived at Amoy, southeast coastal port city threatened by Communist columns closing in from two directions.

It was understood that Gen. Chiang arrived from Chungking, where he has been mapping a new defense line for west China during the past week.

The Nationalist Central News Agency said Nationalist ships and planes have sunk more than 30 junks and small ships along the southeastern coast in an attempt to destroy craft that might be assembled to invade Formosa.

Prague
An official spokesman said today the six persons sentenced to death for organizing a plot to overthrow the Communist regime last spring would be allowed to file appeals.

Despite previous reports that all six had been executed, the spokesman said the sentences had not yet been carried out.

They have not been executed and may lodge an appeal," he said.

Sofia
Bulgaria today accused Greece of provoking at least 25 border incidents between Aug. 22 and Aug. 30.

A government statement said Bulgaria "cannot bear the responsibility for eventual complications" if the border incidents con-

tinued.

Channel Swimmer Seen 3 Miles Off English Coast

DEAL, England, Sept. 3 (UPI)—Coast Guard watchers reported today that Fernand Dumoulin, Belgian resistance hero who started to swim the English Channel from France last night, had been sighted three miles off the English coast near Folkestone.

The Coast Guard report said the 34-year-old Dumoulin, who took two carrier pigeons along to advise his wife of his progress, was swimming strongly against outgoing tides but was not in a position to make much headway.
