Insurance Forms****9 Million Dividend
Cards Received**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8 (UPI)—Veteran's administration sources said today that more than half of the 16 million World War II eligibles already have signed up for their share of the \$2,500,000,000 life insurance dividend to be paid next year.

Dividend application blanks were made available on Aug. 29 to veterans who hold National Service Life Insurance policies. VA announced earlier that all applications would be processed this year but that payments would not begin until early in 1950.

Seven million application cards were received during the first week after they were made available on Aug. 29, a VA spokesman said. "Since then, they have been arriving at VA headquarters at the rate of a million a day."

Work Complicated

This would mean, he said, that as of today VA had received 9 million dividend cards.

This source said that VA's insurance squad of about 2200 employees is finding its work complicated by veterans who are sending in more than one insurance dividend application.

"If a veteran discovers later that he has filled out his application incorrectly," the VA source said, "he should sit tight. VA will advise him that his application is incomplete. But if he sends in a new application, it just slows up the whole works."

**Frank Massey Heads
Polio Fund Campaign**


