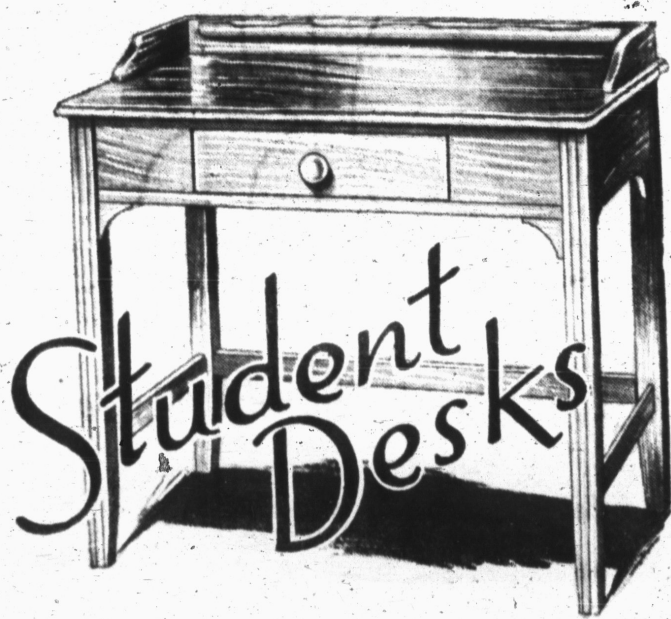

I'm a young man, 21. I would like to get in the Merchant Marines. I would appreciate information concerning where to get my seaman's papers and a list of companies which hire the year-around.

I suggest that you write the United States Maritime Commission, Department of Commerce building, 14 and E Sts. N. W., Washington, D. C., for the information you desire.
Write them in detail concerning your past experience, your training, and the kind of work you do best. The more information you give them the better they can advise you.

If you have a personal job problem, write James Grayson in care of The Times.

This commission has three different districts, namely, the Atlantic Coast District, the Gulf Coast District and the Pacific Coast District. They have field offices at New York City; Norfolk, Va.; Boston, Mass.; Baltimore, Md.; New Orleans, La.; San Francisco, Cal., and San Pedro, Cal.

Whether one of these offices serves Indiana I do not know. Nor do I know whether you would have a choice in selecting the office to which you could make your application. Think out whatever preferences you have and mention them in your letter. Also give them enough information in your first letter to enable them to answer all your questions in their reply to you.

If you prefer to write direct to one of the field offices, here are the addresses of one in each district: 45 Broadway, New York 6, N. Y.; 649 Federal building, New Orleans, La.; and 180 New Montgomery St., San Francisco 4, Cal.
