Then I didn't eat any more ice cream that day."


Points Out Landmarks

A DAD-TO-DAUGHTER AGREEMENT



A MAN-TO-MAN AGREEMENT between Father and Son

(The agreement entered into between father and son, granting permission for said son to drive the family automobile)

...being a licensed driver, do hereby agree

with my father...

That if he will from time to time permit me to drive the automobile that is registered in his name as in his judgment and discretion he may deem proper, I do promise:

1. That, knowing that as the law is concerned, the use of my car are the acts of my father, I will try to drive it as carefully and as safely as he does, and
2. After drinking, I will not allow the car to be driven by anyone who has been drinking in any form of intoxicating liquor while the car is in my charge; and
3. That I fully realize the car is not a plaything but a machine which has power to kill and to injure, and I will not try to show off with it or to kill and to injure.
4. That I will not drive it at any time in excess of the speed limit specified on any city street or over 50 miles per hour on open highways.
5. That I will slow down and look both ways at all intersections even though I may have the right-of-way.

I realize further that this agreement is not legally binding, but I hereby give my father my word of honor that I will do what he has promised above in consideration of his permission to drive the family car.

In witness whereof, I have signed this agreement of my own free will and caused this
