Her affection for taxi drivers stems from the one in New York City who learned she was a foreigner and proceeded to show her all the landmarks. When he drove her back to her ship he refused payment.

A DAD-TO-DAUGHTER AGREEMENT

A MAN-TO-MAN AGREEMENT between Father and Son

(An agreement entered into between father and son, granting permission for said son to drive the family automobile)

I, the father of _____, being a licensed driver, do hereby agree with my father, _____, to sign a "Man-to-Man" agreement.

That if he will from time to time permit me to drive the automobile that is registered in his name as in his judgment and discretion he may deem proper, I do promise:

1. That, leaving motor to the law is understood, my aim is to use and maintain the car as best I can.
2. That, because I am fully aware of the risks involved in driving after drinking, I will not allow the car to be driven by anyone who has been drinking any form of intoxicating liquor while the car is in my charge; and
3. That I fully realize the car is not a plaything but a machine which has power to kill and injure, and I will not try to show off with it;
4. That I will not drive it at any time to excess of the speed limit specified on any city street or over 50 miles per hour on open highways;
5. That I will slow down and look both ways at all intersections even though I may have the right-of-way.

I realize further that this agreement is not legally binding, but I hereby give my father my word of honor that I will do what I have promised above in consideration of his permission to drive the family car.
