# Hebrew New Year Begins Season of Prayer for Jews

Jews of Indianapolis and the world today are celebrating the beginning of the Hebrew New Year 5710.

The Jewish New Year, or Rosh Hashanah, began at sundown last night. Reform congregations will conclude their observance tonight at sundown and conservative and orthodox groups, tomorrow at the same hour.

The feast, one of the most sacred in the Jewish calendar, ushered in a season of penitence and prayer. The High Holy Days will come to a climax with Yom Kippur, or the Day of Atonement, Oct. 3. Then synagogues will stand open all day and faithful Jews everywhere are expected to repent and begin their spiritual life anew.

Those in the know report that Jewish persons who neglect to go to temple throughout the year make a point of being present on Yom Kippur. Thus, the day seems to arouse the reverence of certain Jews just as Easter does for some Christians.

**Altar Banked in White**  
White decorations—flowers and draperies—placed about the altar and the pulpit in the synagogue of the Central Hebrew congregation symbolize the purification of the soul. Rabbi Nandor Fruchter, spiritual director, robed in white, tomorrow will blow the ram's horn in the 7:30 a. m. service. It was not sounded today. The rabbi said, because Saturday is the Sabbath and such procedure is contrary to the law.

Various interpretations are given on the blowing of the shofar. One calls it a commemoration of divine protest against the practice of human sacrifice recalling the story of the binding of Isaac. Another speaks of the blast as a summons to faith in the ultimate victory of righteousness.

Cantor Abraham Portnov is directing the liturgical music for the Central congregation. He performed the same service for 37 years in the Shalom Teilla Synagogue. Rabbi Fruchter, and the cantor held services last night and this morning and will officiate again tonight at 6:15 o'clock.

Rabbi William P. Greenfield and the congregation of Temple Beth-El Zedek will be assisted this year in the observance of the High Holy Days by a new educational director, Fred Weiser. Mr. Weiser has had 20 years' experience in the field of Jewish education. He is a graduate of the Teachers' Institute of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, of the City College of New York and the St. Lawrence University Law School.

**Hold Special Services**  
Special High Holy Days services will be held for adult youth and junior groups in Beth-El Temple. Rabbi Greenfield will give the sermons and Cantor Myro Glass and a robed choir, directed by Walter Goldmann, the musician for the adult services. These were conducted last night and this morning and will continue tonight at 6:30 o'clock and tomorrow at 9 a. m.

Mr. Weiser will direct the services for young people from 13 to 19 years of age tomorrow at 9:30 a. m., as he did this morning at the same hour. The junior service for children up to 13 years of age, in charge of Elliot Werber, will be held tomorrow at 10 a. m. They also were held today at the same hour.

Services will begin at 6:20 o'clock tonight in the synagogue of the United Hebrew Congregation. They will be led by Rabbi Samuel F. Fox who also will conduct services tomorrow at 8 a. m., preach on "Cutting Teeth" at 11 a. m., and hold services again at 5:20 p. m. Rabbi Fox also
