

**Ideal Weather  
Due for Week-end**

High of 85 Degrees  
Predicted Tomorrow

The weatherman promised "mid-summer straw-hat" weather for the parade of collegiate and high school football games tomorrow. He predicted a high of 85 degrees in Indianapolis tomorrow.

Warm Gulf air will flood into the state tomorrow and bring summerlike temperatures which will last until Sunday evening, the Weather Bureau said.

There'll be sunshine left over from tomorrow for Sunday outings and picnics, forecasters said. Tonight's low-temperature reading in Indianapolis is expected to be near 60 degrees.

71° at 11 A.M.  
Despite occasional drizzling rain which brought .03 inch water to the city, the mercury rose to a high of 71 at 11 a.m. yesterday and cooled only to 60 by 5 a.m. today.

Temperatures over the state will range several degrees above normal through Wednesday, weather forecasters said. Showers late Sunday and again Wednesday should bring up to three-fourth inch of rain to portions of the state.

GREENFIELD, Oct. 7 — Two men, shot by a Hancock County farmer when he found them prowling in his yard Tuesday night, today faced preliminary charges of conspiracy to commit a felony.

With his neck and face swathed in bandages, Clyde Holleran, 48, Harrison, O., appeared in Hancock Circuit Court yesterday for a preliminary hearing.

His brother, Swinford Holleran, 26, Anderson, still is in St. John's Hospital in Anderson. His condition is reported to be too serious to permit transfer to the county jail.
