Arrange Services For Col. Winn

LOUISVILLE, Oct. 7 (UP)—Funeral services for Col. Matt Winn, who built a \$3000 country fair event into the Kentucky Derby—America's most publicized horse race—will be held tomorrow at the Cathedral of the Assumption.

The 88-year-old Southerner, who had seen every Kentucky Derby, died in his sleep yesterday after undergoing a series of operations beginning Sept. 9. Winn saw the first Derby from a seat on his father's grocery wagon. He did not begin promoting the race until 1903 when he was 42 years old. Then he began giving the little race a world-wide buildup. The race reached "big time" proportions in 1913 and from then on the Churchill Downs event was a Hollywood-type production attended annually by thousands.
