

### Governor's Parley Fails To End Rail Strike

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 7 (UP)—A conference by four governors with representatives of the Missouri Pacific Railroad and its striking brotherhoods broke up early today with no decision for ending the 26-day-old strike.

Gov. Forrest C. Smith of Missouri, who called the conference, said another meeting would be held later today.

In addition to Gov. Smith, the conference was attended by the governors of Colorado, Arkansas and Kansas, plus executive representatives from Oklahoma, Nebraska, Illinois and Louisiana.

The conference was aimed at ending the walkout which has idled 25,000 workers and cost \$20 million in wages and lost business.
