

## Hint China to Advise Foreign Legations To Evacuate Canton

Decision Taken by Government Officials As Reds Push Within 90 Miles of Key City

Authoritative sources in Canton said today that the Nationalist government had decided to inform foreign legations to leave the Communist-threatened provisional capital and go to Chungking within two weeks.

Nonessential members of the Nationalist government staff were scheduled to begin evacuating Canton next Tuesday, informants said.

The first group to leave was expected to number about 500. An evacuation committee already had chartered 20 transport planes for the mass move to Chungking, the wartime capital deep in China.

A foreign office spokesman said the office had not yet notified the diplomatic corps to evacuate to Chungking. But he said the government had agreed that such an action would be justified when necessary.

The evacuation decision was reported made by the government after the fall of Hengyang, big Nationalist base. The Communist forces pushed within 90 miles of Canton.

Other world developments:

**Berlin**

Reports that Soviet military authorities are preparing to withdraw Russian troops from Berlin as a gesture to the new Communist-dominated east. German state circulated throughout the city today.

These reports, neither confirmed nor denied by Soviet authorities, intended to display the "independence" of the new state, which is scheduled to establish its capital in Berlin.

The Russians will evacuate the main Berlin Kommandatur and hand the building over to the new state, the reports said. The Kommandatur was headquarters of the four-power Allied control council before the Russians broke up the council.

**Belgrade**

Yugoslavia today warned the Hungarian people their Communist government was leading them into the same "catastrophes" of the pre-war regimes which allied them to Adolf Hitler.

The warning was made in an official 1500-word note handed to Hungarian Minister Sandor Keresztes.

It carried Marshal Tito's first answer to the five Soviet satellites who broke their friendship and mutual aid pacts with Yugoslavia.

The note was expected to be followed quickly by similar messages to Poland, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia and Romania.

**London**

Mass arrests in Czechoslovakia suggested to observers today that the Communist government has started a drive to eliminate the possibility of "Titoist" revolts behind the iron curtain.

Prague dispatches indicated that small businessmen were bearing the brunt of the Comintern crackdown.

Mass arrests reportedly began Sunday night and appeared to be continuing with from 2500 to 15,000 persons in custody.

**Vienna**

One man was shot and two others were beaten today in a clash between Communists and Socialist campaigners workers posting placards for the national parliamentary elections tomorrow.

The Interior Ministry reported the outbreak of violence at St. Pölten in the Soviet zone near Vienna.

About a dozen Communists tried to storm Socialist headquarters after the incident, officials said, but were pushed back by police.

**Paris**

President Vincent Auriol was expected today to ask Jules Moch, Socialist Minister of the Interior in the fast three cabinets, to attempt to form a government.
