Church Will Honor Pastor

Dr. Daries Has Served 3 Decades

The 100-year-old Zion Evangelical and Reformed Church tomorrow will honor Dr. Frederick R. Daries for three decades of service.

Pastor Daries assumed the ministry of the Gothic-Romanesque church, North and New Jersey Sts., in 1919, when the building was seven years old. He was instrumental in constructing a new parish hall and educational building in 1928.

His son and daughter, both now married, grew up in the parish. Under the ministry of the pastor aided by Mrs. Daries, the membership has grown steadily over the years. They now number 2007.

Father Second Pastor

The story of the Daries family is bound up with Zion's history. For Dr. Daries' grandfather, the Rev. J. F. Isensee, built its first edifice in 1845 at Ohio and Bird Sts. and was its second pastor. Pastor Daries' mother, the former Alva Isensee, played the organ in Zion Church for three years preceding her marriage in 1903.

Mrs. Richard Moor who was Marianne Daries, daughter of the pastor and Mrs. Daries, is taking graduate work in Cornell University where her husband also is a student. A son, Frederick, lives in Indianapolis.

Pastor Daries will preach tomorrow morning on "Thirty Basins of Gold." The congregation will hold a reception in tribute to Pastor and Mrs. Daries at 3 p. m. in the parish hall. An instrumental trio will play. They are Mrs. Lucille Eddington, pianist; Mrs. Robert Schultz, cellist, and Mrs. Irma Herman, violinist.

Teams to Explain Work of Presbyterians Here, Abroad

Sutherland Presbyterian Church is conducting a visitation on the theory that knowledge opens both the mind and the purse. Tomorrow, teams of two persons each will visit the residences of church members and explain the work of Presbyterians in Indianapolis, the United States and overseas.

They will illustrate what they tell with pictures and stories in a special book titled "Our Church at Work." It is published and distributed by the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A.

The visitors will speak of the missionary outreach of the church into 16 foreign countries and in the United States. They will describe schools, churches, Sunday schools and neighborhood houses for Indians, Eskimos, and Spanish speaking people and others in this

mutual interest, they will present their hosts with pledge cards. These they are expected to fill in with promises of financial support for the church for the coming year.

Sunday, Nov. 13, members will bring the pledge cards to morning worship. Deacons will collect them and move forward to the front of the church. They will stand before the communion table while the pastor, the Rev. Charles Franklin Bruce, dedicates the pledge cards. A robed choir will sing. Above the head of the minister lighted cross will shed its beams stamping the service with solemnity.

The Rev. Mr. Van Ness not only will bring the anniversary services to a close at 7:30 p. m. but he will chart a year of activity. The Edgewood Methodist Quartet will sing and assist with the service.

All next week, evangelistic teams will visit in the homes of the neighborhood and prepare the way for a preaching mission to be given by the pastor. The teams will continue the weekly visits throughout the year.

The congregation was first organized as the Oak Hill Methodist Church. It changed its name first to the Fountain Street Church and later, to Roosevelt Temple. The present edifice was erected in 1924.
