

## The Iron Fist— Communist Foes of Soviet Continue Trek to Belgrade

Most Pilgrims Cheer Loudly for Tito Then  
Return to Labor for 'Independent Party'

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia, Nov. 24.—"Communists who hate Russia" are a new political breed rapidly reproducing their own kind. Their native habitat is Yugoslavia—and Marshal Tito is the granddaddy of them all.

Every trait that puts into some more "Communists who hate Russia" they come to worship at the feet of their Messiah.

"Tito-Tito!" they cheer the first top-dog bolshevik to defy Premier Stalin since Moscow thugs assassinated Leon Trotsky with a gag of bullets.

Most pilgrims to this mecca merely about themselves hoarse—then return to their own lands to labor for "independent communism." Others remain—like brilliant, tough 27-year-old Wolfgang Leonard who just told his story.

### Fed Communism Diet

Today he is not hard to look at, despite the stooped shoulders and catlike intensity of the intellect—and a bush of unruly brown hair.

Wolfgang Leonard was fed a Communist diet practically from prenatal days. His pop—Herr Rudolph Leonard—was a Leninist writer in Alt Deutschland.

Pop wisely decided against excessive intimacy with the Gestapo.

He bundled his brood off to Moscow . . . and there the boy Wolfgang matriculated at a college of Communist knowledge.

Wolfgang was polished for a post-war push. He was to play a major role in communizing the ruined Reich.

He was one of the passengers on a plane from Moscow to Tempelhof, which landed shortly after Hitler went up like a toasted marshmallow in his Berlin bunker.

**Taught in Berlin**  
Wolfgang taught at the high (Communist) party school in Berlin, where banking is not on the curriculum. Students believed "most likely to succeed" are farmed out to key points of agitation—for the red tag.

Once he was back home, though, little buds of doubt began to sprout in the massive mind of Herr Professor Wolfgang. He found—The Communist Party in his quartered fatherland was strictly a stage for the Red Army.

The free Germany he had dreamed about was not on the blueprint . . . the Reich was to be a colony.

Sacred promises were violated by the slow discharge of captured wehrmacht warriors . . . discharged when they looked more miserable than in newsreel clips of the chilly retreat from Moscow.

In 1947 Wolfgang visited Yugoslavia. Here—Eureka!—"I found it!" The true Communist state. He saw (he says) cleaning-women eating in the same restaurant with party bosses.

He saw a degree of freedom and equality unknown in Russia. "For not even in capitalistic countries are there such great differences of position and pay."

**Tito Fitted Out**  
Freedom, like beauty, is comparative. The guy on the chain gang thinks that a stroll without his ankle bracelet is "freedom."

Wolfgang was conducting class in Berlin when Marshal Tito was pitched out of the Cominform, charged with more violations than

busted Belgrade seems to bring hate Russia." From the United States, Italy, Germany, France . . . they come to worship at the feet of their Messiah.

"When I read Yugoslavia's reply—that was the greatest moment of my life," sighs Wolfgang, like an actor whose opinion has not been dropped.

"For the first time the Communist Party was making communism . . . not Russian propaganda."

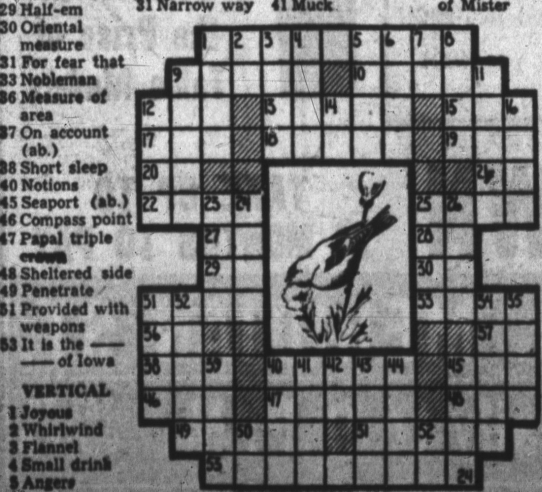

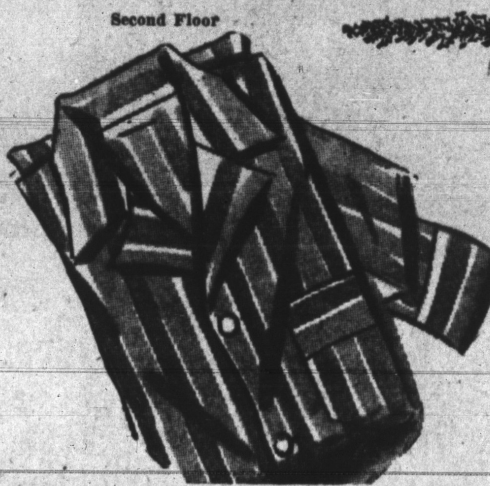

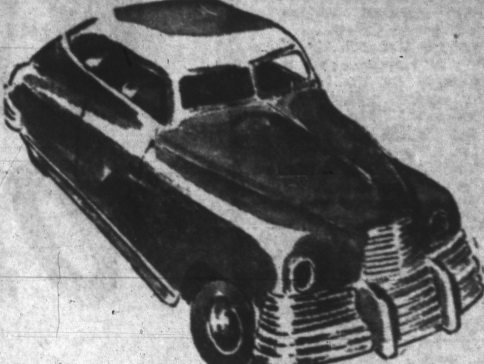
